Menlo College Transfer Credit Agreement

2010 – 2011 Catalog Requirements

WHY SHOULD YOU TRANSFER TO MENLO COLLEGE?

1. Transfer Students are an Integral Part of the Menlo College Community.

Approximately 35% of Menlo's 700 students have transferred from community colleges and other 4-year colleges and universities—from all over the United States and around the world.

2. You Will be Treated as a Person, Not a Number.

You will be advised every step of the way—by your admissions counselor, academic advisor, faculty advisor, career services office, through to becoming an alumnus of Menlo College.

3. Menlo is "Transfer-Friendly."

Transfer applications are accepted for both fall and spring semesters. There is no minimum number of units required to transfer; however, students with fewer than 12 transferable units must also submit high school transcripts and SAT or ACT scores.

Transfer Agreements

Menlo has developed Articulation Agreements with many California community colleges in order to facilitate the course selection process for students who are going to transfer to Menlo. Students do not need to complete all courses on the Agreement before transferring.

Transfer Credit

A maximum of 94 total semester units (70 lower division and 24 upper division) may be transferred to Menlo. Menlo generally grants credit for courses in which a C- or better was earned, if those courses have equivalents at Menlo (or are CSU or UC transferable for California community college students).

Prior Associate's Degree or IGETC

Students transferring with an approved associate's degree or having satisfied the IGETC (Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum) automatically satisfy most lower division General Education requirements. You are still required to take prerequisite courses needed to register for specific upper division classes.

Credit from Non-Traditional Sources

Menlo evaluates credit from several sources including Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate, CLEP, and Military Education and Experience.

4. A Straightforward Admission Process

Applications are accepted on a continuing basis, following a rolling admissions policy. However, priority status is given to students who complete the applications by December 1 for Early Action Consideration, or by our priority deadlines of February 1 for the Fall semester and November 1 for the Spring semester.

Please submit the following along with your application:

- \$40 Application fee
- Personal statement, at least 250 words, including the following:
 - An evaluation of your college experience to date
 - Your reason(s) for seeking transfer to Menlo College
 - How you perceive that your educational objectives can be met at Menlo

- Official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended
- High School Transcript and official SAT or ACT scores for students transferring with fewer than 12 units

Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) exam is required for International Students. F-1 visa students who transfer colleges within the United States and who have successfully completed courses equivalent to Menlo's first year English language requirements (English Composition 1 and 2) are not required to present TOEFL, SAT, or ACT scores.

5. Menlo Helps You Finance Your Education.

Menlo College is committed to making a high quality education affordable. At Menlo, 88% of our students receive some form of financial assistance through college, state, and federal funds in the form of scholarships, grants, loans, and on-campus employment. To apply, submit your completed Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA, www.fafsa.gov), preferably by March 2. If you are a California resident and have not previously been awarded a Cal Grant, submit a GPA Verification Form by March 2 as well.

Full-time transfer students, both U.S. citizens and citizens of other countries, may qualify for one of several merit scholarships. Awards range from \$5,000 to \$15,000 per year and are renewable.

Please Note:

- Students do not need to complete all courses on the Agreement before transferring.
- Approved Associates Degrees or IGETC Certification will receive Credit for meeting General Education Requirements. The following exceptions apply:
 - Menlo College requires all graduates to complete the equivalent of MGT 101, ECO 200, MIS 100, and, depending on major, MTH 102 or MTH 111.
 - LIT 304 must be taken at Menlo College if student has not taken the equivalent of HIS 111 AND HIS 112.
 - Specific courses may be required as a prerequisite for Major and/or Concentration upper division courses.
- Vocational Associates Degrees will not be accepted.
- Menlo College does not grant transfer credit to non-degree applicable, basic skills, preparatory, remedial, ESL, vocational and correspondence courses.
- A grade of "C-" or better must be earned in order for a course to be considered for transfer credit.
- Courses may only be taken once for transfer credit to Menlo College.
- Courses may only satisfy one requirement at Menlo College.
- Courses not specifically noted but which will be considered for transfer as general elective units on a case-by-case basis.
- Transfer students will receive credit for the total number of units accepted for transfer. However, grades received in transfer courses will not be counted in a student's Menlo College GPA.
- All *College of San Mateo* courses are lower division. Lower division courses will not satisfy an upper division requirement even if course content is the same. Students may appeal this issue to the Faculty Appeals Committee.
- Up to 70 semester units of lower division course work may be transferred to Menlo. A maximum of 2 semester units of P.E. will be accepted for transfer.
