**GE Block Transfer**

Brandman accepts the full CSU or UC IGETC general education certification to satisfy all GE requirements except LBSU 300, LBSU 302 and University Degree Qualifications. The University Degree Qualifications may be completed through residential coursework taken in the major or through residential electives.

Certification must be completed prior to the student's first term admitted, enrolled and attending. Students who matriculate to Brandman with partial GE certifications will have their coursework evaluated on a course by course basis to determine appropriate applicability to each general education category.

Completion of the full CSU or UC IGETC certification (CA), Washington and Oregon state-approved Direct Transfer degrees or other state's equivalent transfer certification prior to the student being admitted, enrolled and attending his/her first session in a bachelor degree program at Brandman satisfies all Brandman University GE requirements except LBSU 300. Students who matriculate to Brandman with partial GE certifications will have their coursework evaluated on a course by course basis to determine appropriate applicability to each general education category.

**All courses must be passed with a grade equivalent of "C" or higher. Courses may be used to fulfill both major and general education requirements.**
