LEGISLATIVE BILLS

S 2685

Motion to approve Senator Chettipally seconded by Senator Riley

With 13 in favor, 0 against and 0 abstaining motion passes.

S 1106

This would support students that are in middle colleges, allow them to apply for Pell grant up to 4 semester before they make it to college. Access to financial aid that they don't currently have.

Motion to approve presented by Senator Awwad seconded by Vice Chair Chin

With 13 in favor, 0 against and 0 abstaining motion passes.

S 2222

This would provide a grant to community colleges. IT would give you basic training and send you to i.e. an auto shop, paid internship, when you complete it, the auto shop will hire you. This grant would give colleges money to work with local businesses and copy. (Not all specialties, certain things will not be available)

Motion to approve presented by Senator Wang seconded by Senator Riley

With 13 in favor, 0 against and 0 abstaining motion passes.

HR 108

Students coming out of college with student loans, can get into a contract with an employer to get a tax break, and that tax break would go into the student loans.

HR 3331

Grants for Safe and Drug free schools, bullying included. Counselor offices, peer mentors walking around. They have to report everything.

With 13 in favor, 0 against and 0 abstaining motion passes.

HR 1490

Similar to mental health/bullying. Sexual assault services for victims creates a safe space office, separate to other offices. Services provided counseling, general safe space, a place to report. To get statistics as well (not their main goal) Motion to approve presented by Senator Riley seconded by Senator Awwad.

Student who have applied for Pell grant only available for Fall and Spring, taking Summer Classes makes it more pricey. This bill awards Summer Pell Grants
