This would support students that are in middle colleges, allow them to apply for Pell grant up to 4 semester before they make it to college. Access to financial aid that they don't currently have.

On April 29, 2017, CSM's Ethnic Studies department will host its 8th Annual Asian American Film Festival. The featured film will be Daze of Justice, with related discussion activities to follow. The trailer for the film can be viewed at <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=esxYAO0SGtg> .

Daze of Justice is a documentary film that follows the stories of three Cambodian American women who fled genocide in Cambodia and came as refugees to the U.S. in the 1980s. More than 30 years later, they return to Cambodia to testify at the United Nations International Tribunal against the leaders of the regime (called the Khmer Rouge) that inflicted the genocide, during which more than 2 million Cambodians died of starvation, disease, overwork, torture, and execution. These women have to leave behind the security and familiarity of their lives in the U.S., remember their painful pasts and, in an unexpected twist of fate, they meet the son of one of the most notorious executioners. The story thus addresses issues of seeking justice and closure, but also finding empathy and cultivating forgiveness. The Cambodian American experience is relevant not only for students of Asian American studies and American history, but given the current dialogue about refugees in the United States, the topics addressed in the film are particularly poignant.

The film is free for all SMCCD students, faculty, and staff. The event will begin at 6:30pm and end approximately 10pm on Saturday, April 29. The event will be hosted by Ethnic Studies at the CSM Theatre and will be moderated by Dr. Christine Su of the International Education Program. Attendees will have the opportunity to meet the survivors featured in the film during a Q&A session, followed by a reception in the Theatre lobby. We would love to have your assistance with publicizing the event, as well as student volunteers (handing out programs, assisting with set up/clean up).
