REPORTS

President Riley hoped that everyone was having a good second week.

Vice President Relos briefed the Executive Cabinet on the Sustainability Committee meeting she attended the day prior. Ms. Relos indicated interest in conducting a "zero waste day," in which non-reusable utensils, plates, and cups, would be substituted for reusable items. She also stated that she was willing to work with other student governments in the district to potentially expand transportation options for students.

Advocacy Board Chair Topete Eng Goon asked members to bring up any issues they heard from students, ones that could be reviewed further by Advocacy Board and the Senate.

Programming Board Chair Bathai declared that meetings for Programming Board would take place every Monday from 1:10 p.m. to 2:00 p.m.

Student Life and Leadership Assistant Hamadeh reported that the ID card printer was still inoperable; he also announced that CSM President Mike Claire and Vice President of Student Services Kim Lopez would be attending the Senate meeting on Monday, August 28, 2017. The meeting would take place in Building 10, Room 194, instead of College Heights Conference Room.

PLANNING UPDATE FOR FALL 2017 WELCOME WEEK

Vice President Relos apprised the Executive Cabinet on the upcoming Fall 2017 Welcome Week event, revealing that everything was going smoothly. Gift bags that students would receive at the event were to be packed the following day, Friday, August 25, from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Ms. Relos requested fellow members to share a draft of the Welcome Week survey with other students, especially those who had already graduated from CSM; this survey would be opened up to the public on Friday of the same week. Both Vice President Relos and Commissioner of Publicity were working on an official flyer for the event, as well as the social media giveaway and survey.

CALIFORNIA COMMUNITY COLLEGE STUDENT AFFAIRS ASSOCIATION CONFERENCE

Advisor Hamadeh stated that applications to attend the California Community College Student Affairs Association Conference in San Jose were due by 12:00 p.m. on Friday, August 25; a ten-person limit was established in accordance with the one advisor to ten students ratio set by conference regulations. The Executive Cabinet discussed how long ASCSM representatives would be attending the conference, and determined that they would drive to San Jose on the afternoon of October 13, then return to campus the evening of October 14.

SUPPORT FOR VICTIMS OF NEPAL FLOODING

The recent flood crisis in Nepal was brought to the Executive Cabinet's attention by Senator Soni, who had relatives currently living in Nepal. Advisor Schaefer indicated that the Senate could either plan a fundraiser event to help support victims of the flooding, or match funds and send the money to an organization that would be able to help the victims directly. President Riley indicated that more information was needed to further plan for this item, though it would be added to the agenda for the next Senate meeting.
