Out-of-Pocket Cost Breakdown

Food on own:

- All meals (not provided by WPA or Hotel) 3 dinners, 2 breakfasts, 2 lunches (\$70)
- Colorado Blvd and The Paseo restaurants walking distance from the Convention Center

Transportation on own:

Possible Options:

Driving: 6.5 hours and approx \$35 in gas per way= \$70 (round trip)

OR

Airfare and Uber: \$20.10 public transit to and from SJC, \$106 SJC to LAX (round trip) on Alaska through Skyscanner.com, \$80 Uber from LAX to Hilton and back= \$196.50 round trip

Total out of pocket= \$140-277.00

Many of these presenters will hold a conversation hour with students immediately after the presentation. There will also be special programs for students sponsored by Psi Chi, the International Honor Society in Psychology and workshops on topics in statistics and research methods. We are looking forward to an exciting convention program that will be a valuable learning experience for students.




