Motion to recommend approval of \$300.00 to fund refreshments for a World Chat event sponsored by the Southeast Asia Club focused on the Malay language by Psychology Club; seconded by Nepalese Student Association. By a vote of 25 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining, the motion carried.
