A career in Building Inspection includes review and interpretation of plans and diagrams for compliance with codes and ordinances; inspection of new and existing residential, commercial, and industrial buildings during and after construction to enforce and certify them for safety and code compliance; assurance of structural integrity and plumbing, electrical, and mechanical systems in the sale and exchange of property; work with architects, engineers, contractors, and property owners to ensure proper use of material and workmanship; review and approval of final inspection certificates; issuance of permits and assessment/collection of fees; and maintenance of reports on all inspections conducted and permits issued. Some students specialize I areas such as residential dwellings, and structural steel or reinforced concrete buildings.
