The Curriculum Handbook is currently being updated. Additional policies will be included in the handbook including regular effective contact for DE courses.

For courses that have more than one discipline, information on discipline assignment will be added to the course in CurricUNET as an attached file.

The 6th edition of the Program and Course Approval Handbook (PCAH) is being drafted and will be taken to the State Board for approval. PCAH is the reference for curriculum submissions.

Per new guidelines being proposed, experimental courses can be offered only 2 times then they have to be submitted as permanent courses. There is a timing issue with our current scheduling cycles. Some experimental courses are offered once a year, some are offered fall and spring. In the past, faculty submitters have proposed experimental courses to facilitate approval, and proposed permanent courses at the same time. Would it be possible to offer an experimental course two times, propose a permanent course and offer the experimental course again while waiting for the permanent course approval?

There was a discussion on automatic banking of experimental courses. The courses should be banked after 2 offerings or if they were approved but never offered. We have to keep track of these. Courses can be banked by proposing deactivation in CurricUNET, or by memo to COI. The Chair will provide updated information on automatic banking.

The Chair presented on how hours/units are calculated. Information will be added to the handbook. When reviewing courses, COI members should consider the course outline content to see if the hours and units for the course seem appropriate or should be less - or more.

There is a training for COI representatives on August 25, 2016 from 2:15 to 4:00. It will be a handson training. Sandra will remind the Deans that each division needs to have 2 COI representatives. We will need the names of members: current/continuing and incoming.

Teresa suggested that COI representatives review the courses and put in their comments early so these can be addressed prior to the meeting.

Note: The April 28th meeting might be cancelled. Committee members will be notified of changes in scheduled meetings.
