Substantive Agenda

Courses listed on the substantive agenda have been reviewed for listed changes. Though courses on the substantive agenda may have changes in prerequisites and/or recommended preparation, the full committee is expected to review prerequisites and recommended preparations statements for all proposals to ensure compliance with Title V regulations.

New Courses

- ARCH 146 Introduction to Advanced 3D Digital Modeling (1) *approved, with catalog description revision; discipline assignment: Architecture*
- ARCH 225 Making Architecture: Building Methods, Materials & Design Build 1 (3) *approved; discipline assignment: Architecture*
- BUS. 672 Cooperative Education: Internship (1-3) *approved; discipline assignment: Business*

This is a practical experience course where students can get credit for work hours. There is a faculty coordinator who will supervise students. CSM's cooperative education courses have previously been banked. BUS. 672 is the first cooperative education class to be proposed for this school year; there is interest in proposing additional cooperative classes. Instead of using "COOP" as a prefix, the course number "672" will be used to designate that a course is a cooperative course. The TOP code for the corresponding discipline should be used.

ETHN 122 Black Leadership Theory (3) – approved, with GEs; discipline assignments: Ethnic Studies, African American Studies, Sociology, English, Counseling, Business, History, Political Science

(Proposed for GE areas: E5b Social Science and E5d Career Exploration and Self-Development)

Leadership can be covered by many different disciplines and taught by instructors with different backgrounds. Deans have the right of assignment. Sandra Stefani Comerford, Vice President of Instruction, advised caution when assigning classes; we have to make sure the instructor is qualified. This course has 8 discipline assignments for now. The list can change; we can add or subtract disciplines at a later time.

ETHN 123 Black Leadership Practicum (3) – approved, with change in GE from E5b to E5d; discipline assignments: Ethnic Studies, African American Studies, Sociology, English, Counseling, Business, History, Political Science (Proposed for GE area: E5b Social Science)

After discussions, it was decided that GE area E5d Career Exploration and Self-Development is a better fit than E5b Social Science.

LIT. 154 Introduction to LGBT Literature (3) – approved, with GEs; discipline assignment: English

(Proposed for GE areas: E2b English, literature, Speech Communication; E2c Communication and Analytical Thinking; E5c Humanities)

There is a question on the acronyms LGBT, GLBTQ, and LGBTQ which are used in the title, description, objectives, and content. The course is approved as is for now; COI can take a memo if the acronyms will be modified.

LIT. 221 World Literature from 1600 (3) – approved, with change in title; GEs approved; discipline assignment: English

(Proposed for GE areas: E2b English, literature, Speech Communication; E2c Communication and Analytical Thinking; E5c Humanities)

The title changed from Survey of World Literature II to World Literature from 1600. This course will be replacing LIT. 220.

MATH 280 Proofwriting (4) – approved; GEs are not needed; discipline assignment:

Mathematics

(Proposed for CSM Competency: C1: Math/Quantitative Reasoning and GE area: E2c Communication and Analytical Thinking)

MATH 800 Just-in-Time Support for Elementary Probability and Statistics (2) – *approved; discipline assignment: Mathematics*(DE supplement)

MATH 800, 820, and 890 were created to comply with AB 705. They are considered as add-on courses to regular Math classes. Since this is the first time we are offering this type of classes, we can expect to see them again in the near future for possible revisions as we learn from experience.

The intent is to provide additional support for Math students and improve their success rate. The add-on courses help cover material that the students might have missed. Previously, students who started Math at the lowest level needed to take 3 Math classes before reaching transfer level math courses. We lose students to attrition as they go through the different Math courses.

The add-on courses will be linked to their respective corequisite courses: MATH 800 with MATH 200; MATH 820 with MATH 120; MATH 890 with MATH 190. Students are required to take and pass both classes. MATH 200, 120, and 190 are letter graded; 800, 820, and 890 courses are Pass/No Pass.

There was a comment that each paired class will take a lot of students' time, leaving them less time to take other courses. For example, MATH 820 and MATH 120 comprise 8 units. Christopher Walker replied that research shows students are more successful in courses with high unit values.

The Just-in-Time courses are being offered as distance education since historically, online MATH courses are popular. The courses will probably be more hybrid than online.

Financial Aid covers 30 units of non-degree applicable courses.

The add-on courses are patterned after Cuyamaca College's successful model. Their experience showed student success rate improved four or five times compared to previous rates. Lower-performing students had the highest gains.

There are plans to eventually drop the two lowest MATH classes: MATH 811 and 110.
