# College of San Mateo Information and Procedures for SPECIAL PROJECT 690 COURSES

Updated 10/10/2014

A 690 course can be offered in any discipline where there is an established 690 number. The course is an opportunity for an eligible student to do independent study under the direction of a discipline faculty member and under the supervision of the division dean. The course is developed as advanced study in a specific discipline to enhance the student's depth of knowledge and experience beyond the established curriculum in that discipline.

#### Who is eligible to enroll in a 690 course?

- The student must meet the prerequisite: Students are eligible request approval of a 690 course only after completion of at least 2 college courses in the subject field and a 3.0 GPA in the subject field.
- Normally a student may be enrolled in only one 690 course in a semester.
- The offering of a 690 Special Project course is based on the interest and availability of a discipline faculty to supervise a course and the approval of the Division Dean.

#### How many units for a 690 course?

- A 690 Special Project course may be available for 1, 2, or 3 units. The specific unit value is identified in the individual 690 Course Contract.
- Course work is established with lab hours based on a 16 week semester. For summer term the same minimum number
  of work and student-teacher contact hours is required but the weekly hours must be adjusted to comply with a shorter
  term.

1 unit of 690 course work =
minimum of 48 hours
3 hours of work per week to include 1
hour of direct student-teacher contract as
identified in the Course Contract record
of student-teacher contact hours.

2 units of 690 course work =
minimum of 96 hours
6 hours of work per week to include 2
hours of direct student-teacher contract
as identified in the Course Contract
record of student-teacher contact hours.

3 units of 690 course work =
minimum of 144 hours
9 hours of work per week to include 3
hours of direct student-teacher contract
as identified in the Course Contract
record of student-teacher contact hours.

### Does a 690 course meet degree requirements?

- A 690 Special Project course does not meet a requirement for an associate degree, certificate, or transfer. Typically a
  690 course is designed for advanced independent study. The course and units are elective units that are applied to the
  associate degree and to CSU (California State University) transfer only. The 690 course is not intended to supplant or
  replicate a course established in the college catalog.
- In limited cases, a 690 course can be approved by the Division Dean as a course substitute for a CSM associate degree or certificate requirement. This course substitution approval should be noted in the Course Contract.

# What is the procedure to establish a 690 Special Project course and what is the enrollment process?

- 1. The discipline faculty and student develop a course of study and student learning outcomes and determine the appropriate unit value of the project related to the time investment noted above. The discipline faculty confirms that the student meets eligibility (as noted above) for the 690 Special Project course.
- 2. The discipline faculty and student complete a 690 Special Project Course Contract and submit the signed Contract to the Division Dean for review and signature approval.
- 3. If approved by the Division Dean, the Division Office, the discipline faculty, and the student receive a copy of the contract.
- 4. The Division Assistant assists the student to enroll in the Special Project 690 course. When enrollment is complete, the Course Contract begins.
- 5. At the conclusion of the term, the Course Contract, Student-Teacher Contact record, and student learning outcomes are reviewed and assessed. A copy of the completed Contract is submitted to the Division Office and scanned into WebXtender. The grade for the course is recorded by the faculty in WebSMART.
