

#### DRAFT GOALS OF CSM's GUIDED PATHWAYS

CSM will improve the student experience to better help <u>all</u> students ...

#### Access a High-Quality Education

- Bring services to students instead of waiting for them to access services (EMP)
- · Work with feeder schools
- Coordinate with 4-year universities and workforce

#### **Know Their Goals**

- Many students don't know what they want to major in or what careers to explore
- Many students are overwhelmed by the options, don't know which courses to take, when
- Many students are unaware of the planning resources available to them (process)
- Not enough counselors or counseling appointments available

#### **Achieve Their Goals**

- · Many students are overwhelmed by the options, don't know which courses to take, when
- Many students are unaware of the planning resources available to them (process)
- Not enough courses and sections available when needed (structural)
- Not enough counselors or counseling appointments available

#### **Achieve Equitable Outcomes**

- · Learning communities, though effective, only target a small number of students
- Not all groups of students are achieving their goals at the same rate

#### **NEXT STEPS: PREPARING FOR REDESIGN for student success**

Providing clear information and support to CSM's students in all phases of their educational journey is key. In practice, what does this mean? In the Design phase, we will need to:

- <u>Re-structure</u>: Re-package our courses, programs, and services differently in order to better inform and better deliver instruction and services to <u>all</u> students.
- Expand: Identify and scale current successful practices to help a greater number of students.
- <u>Innovate</u>: Implement best practices in student services and instruction to better address <u>all</u> students' needs, supported by a robust professional development program.
