YEAR 2 (College of San Mateo -2019) Tentative activities related to timeline

Laying groundwork for implementation

- <u>Create program maps (including plans for exploratory majors) for all programs and fields (See table below and attachments with samples from Cabrillo)</u>
- Plan redesign of intake system—including integration of supports into program gateway courses (See integrated plan on the Five year plan handout)
- Plan reorganization of advising to support timely program entry and completion
- Plan upgrade of student information system to support progress monitoring and enable early alerts
- Continue broad communication and engagement
- Train advisors and faculty for year 3 implementation
