Jennifer presented the budget. Since there are some faculty representatives that are not here, we will need to revisit the budget and approve at the next meeting. The primary discussion today new Division's integration of the budget with the Director of Equity. This is a collaborative budget. The joint committee, Division and Cabinet need to discuss the roles, whether we are a decision-making or advisory body. The discussion centered on collaboration and integration, but with a view not to have certain communities and programs slip through the cracks.

A copy of BSI Guidelines were distributed to the committee. Per the guidelines, we will have to spend only on allowed items. Important items not allowed in the guidelines could be funding with other funds.

A copy of Equity Guidelines were distributed to the committee. Equity is a little more flexible. But again, certain items are not allowed under the guidelines.

Equity Budget:

Jennifer discussed the Equity budget for FYs 14-15 through 17-18. Some funds rolled to succeeding fiscal years will have to be spent by the end of the current fiscal year. Not all Equity programs and communities are under her Division, but we are proposing an integrated budget.

BSI Budget:

We have to spend \$62,851 by this fiscal year. Jeremiah is handling BSI, because we have no coordinator.

What does it look like to imagine BSI through an equity lens? (10 minutes)

BSI at is core is to achieve equity for BS students. Think through BSI develop criteria viewing BSI through an equity lens. Exercise we did last meeting, was designed to get at this. What is the frame to address the needs of the most underserved students? The group agreed on homework for the next meeting: read the Equity Plan. Look at the categories and needs sections and jot down "golden lines." This committee will develop a rubric with more representation of faculty. Since both committees are IPC committees the IPC goals statements will need to be updated with this new mission. Theresa will bring the template to the committee next time. Lorena will provide the Equity logic model. Theresa will send out all of the foundation documents discussed here.

V. DIAG/Equity share-out on pertinent/pressing issues

This agenda item was covered under previous discussions. We need to discuss do we continue with the current Equity deficit, or look at the specific line items for reductions. Diversity Planning Committee has limited funding, (\$4,000). This needs to be added to our standing items for meetings. Equity now funds DIAG. Some of the projects, like books, need some tracking information on usage.

VI. Identifying overlap & common threads between BSI & DIAG/Equity

Henry has resigned as co-chair DIAG. Organizing leadership will be discussed. The current co-chairs of DIAG-BSI are Jeremiah and Theresa as faculty representative. The committee approved the change in leadership. Jennifer all who are on both committees about serving and examine who needs to serve, within the context of this being an IPC participatory governance committee.
