### 1. Call to order

• Meeting called to order at 2:35 p.m.

### 2. Introductions

• Chairperson Danni Redding Lapuz introduced new committee members and recognized those for whom it was their final meeting.

### 3. <u>Approval of Minutes</u>

• The committee voted to approve the May 9, 2017 minutes.

## 4. Fall 2017 International Student Report

- The new Districtwide International Student Report was distributed to committee members
- Supplemental year over year report created by Danni Redding Lapuz was also distributed
- Chairperson Danni Redding Lapuz reported that
  - There is a recent trend of a lower number of visa approvals in Nepal
  - o Noted that College of San Mateo overall enrollment continued to increase
  - Reduced rate of growth for international students at CSM has allowed the International Education Program and other impacted areas on campus to regroup and plan for the future
  - Next meeting a report with a breakdown by country will be distributed

## 5. Fall 2017 Orientation Recap

- Chairperson Danni Redding Lapuz reported that
  - o 212 new international students arrived on campus for the fall 2017 semester
  - The new student registration process was positively impacted by the number of available ESL courses for fall 2017.
  - Placement testing is under review the new assessment tools and cut scores have resulted in some students who are under prepared for classes. Cut score revalidation is in process.
     Danni will provide historical placement data to assist with the cut score validation process.
- The Model Curriculum used for international student registration was distributed.

- The International Education Program has a new home!
  - $\circ$  We are still in Building 10 on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, but on the opposite side around the corner from the cashiers.
  - New space includes admissions office (10-393), student lounge (10-392), Retention Specialist (10-392A), Program Manager (10-381), Meditation Room (10-3801)
    Lobby with entrance door and student check-in area coming winter/spring 2017/2018

# 8. <u>Campus Internationalization</u>

- Chairperson Danni Redding Lapuz distributed a new College of San Mateo mission statement draft

   Draft statement is more accommodating of international student population
   Draft statement is still under review and may have further comments and revisions
- Chairperson Danni Redding Lapuz reported that:
  - o Inter-Cultural Communication Class will be interviewing selected international students
    - Preliminary talks about other potential courses and projects more to come
  - Campus Wellness Center Intern will lead a Drama Therapy workshop with International Student Ambassadors
  - Campus Counseling Intern is interested in working with our international students and is being mentored by CSM counselor Martin Bednarek.
  - o First joint ESL and IEP professional development around international students.
    - Issues addressed included plagiarism and general strategies
    - Hope to continue to provide useful takeaways at each Flex Day session
- IPC Task Force met three times during the 2016-2017 academic year and
  - o Gathered faculty feedback regarding international student population
    - o Developed a vision around international student population and campus internationalization
    - o Surveyed faculty with a high concentration of international students in their classroom
    - Created a plan to present to the full IPC using the survey data gathered.
      - Plan addresses enrollment management and professional development
  - Need to be pro-active rather than reactive when looking at internationalization Group is not intended to meet in perpetuity but to gather data and develop a plan that will frame the future of campus internationalization, including programs and professional development.

# 9. <u>Study Abroad</u>

• Chairperson Danni Redding Lapuz reported on the following available Study Abroad programs:

- Semester Length programs Florence is next
- Short-Term programs with an approved service provider
  - Faculty and staff were informed that all short-term programs must be with an approved provider
  - Program promoters who regularly email are generally not district approved providers
- Community Travel
  - Designed as for profit study abroad travel available to community members
  - Profits are used to fund Study Abroad opportunities for students who cannot afford them

## • Global Internships

- 6-8 weeks in the summer Unpaid
- Options include Capetown, Dublin, Hong Kong, New York, Prague, San Francisco, Santiago, Singapore
- Internship fee \$5,000 to \$7,000
- Scholarships Available

## 10. <u>Other</u>

- District International Fall 2017 New & Updates Newsletter distributed to all attendees
- SalesForce launched as the new international student application system for spring 2018 applications
  - Better front end system for end users (applicants)
  - More and better data will become available over time
- Pre-departure orientations held in China, Myanmar and Nepal
  - Checklists, logistics and acculturation tips were included
  - o Parents, students high school representatives etc. attended
  - EdUSA sites used to host the events. NOTE: EdUSA does not promote specific schools
  - Application fee waiver given to all students who attended a session
- Library is fully operational for all students
- Student government committee representative Qingyang Xu raised some current international student interest and issue areas. Group discussion followed.
