# 7.1 Enrollment

2014/15 unduplicated enrollment = 9,629. 5% increase = 10,110, or 481 additional students.

#### 1.1 Retention Rate

2014/15 total course enrollments = 46,635.3

Retention rate = 84.8% (39,546).

5% increase = 41,878, or 2,332 additional retained enrollments

To put it another way, there were 7,089 total course W's.

2,332 of these 7,089 W's need to move to retained enrollments (A,B,C,D, or F). This = 33.0% of total course W's. At an average 4.8 course enrollments per student per academic year, 2,332 enrollments = 486 students.

# 1.3 Successful Course Completion Rate

2014/15 total course enrollments = 46,635.

Success rate = 71.1% (33,157).

5% increase = 35,489, or 2,332 additional successful completions.

To put it another way, there were 13,478 total course non-successes (grades of D,F, or W). 2,332 additional success completions need to be achieved. This = 17.3% of non-success grades-approximately1 in 6 of all non-success grades.

At an average 4.8 course enrollments per student per academic year, 2,332 successful enrollments = 486 students.
