
New data storage (Sharepoint)

big data empiricism: inductive

Good for identifying hitherto unsuspected patterns or trends in a blizzard of data points

Relies on large quantities of solid, representative data from which meaningful inferences can be drawn

Requires specialist training to analyze trends and patterns




small data empiricism: experimental

Good for exploring solutions to already-identified problems

Relies on intentional, purposeful questions

Does not necessarily require large data pools

Non-experts can interpret and make use of results



what changed

old	new
Start with the data collection	Start with the question
Assess SLOs or courses by turns	Prioritize a relevant learning question
Don't use grades	Use whatever data answers the question
Build a KSI-style datapool	Narratives of experiments / research
Map to assess PSLOs / ILOs	Map to review curriculum (GP!)
Compliance mandate (data entry)	Reflection mandate (schedule discussions)

connecting assessment to planning

discipline/service faculty:

- Fall: Create an assessment plan
- Spring: Document results
- Every two years: Summarize activities in Program Review



College Assessment Committee:

- Fall/Spring: organize interdisciplinary assessment activities
- Every two years: Summarize College-wide activities in Assessment Report
