



Sample MLA “Works Cited” Page

“Works Cited” is a list of citations at the end of a research paper and is numbered as a continuation of the text. Items are alphabetized by author. When no author is given, alphabetize by title, ignoring “A” “An” or “The” if one of these is the first word. Use a five space indentation for all lines after the first entry. Double space the entire list.
