CSM Transfer Services

Transfer Services provides a full range of services to students seeking to transfer to a university. We work closely with college and university counselors and admissions staff to help students with their transfer goals including arranging individual appointments with university representatives. Representatives from UC, CSU, and private universities present workshops on university selection procedures, writing the application essay and completing admission applications.

Transfer Club

Be part of a special group of students who have the “inside track” on transferring! Transfer Club students have the greatest access to college representatives, transfer information and priority invitations for university tours. Students can increase their chances for university admission and gain a competitive advantage while networking with other students about the transfer process.

Guaranteed Transfer Contracts

What is a Guaranteed Transfer Contract?

A Guaranteed Transfer Contract (GTC) is a formal written agreement that outlines the College of San Mateo courses you must complete before transferring to a participating institution. Upon completion of GTC requirements, transfer admission is guaranteed.

What are the GPA requirements for a GTC?

GTC's generally require a minimum of 3.0 GPA for UC; 2.0 GPA for CSU; and 2.5 GPA for private/independent colleges and universities depending on the university and major.

Do all 4-year institutions offer GTC's?

Only a limited number of 4-year colleges and universities offer GTC's.

Is a GTC required for transfer?

A GTC is not required for transfer. In addition, transfer students get priority admission to all UC's and CSU's. Visit assist.org for UC & CSU transfer information.

How do I get started on my GTC?

Make an appointment with an academic counselor or advisor to set up an educational plan by calling (650)574-6400.

PRIORITY DEADLINE: September 1-30. Need minimum of 30 UC Transferable units to apply for a TAG

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, DAVIS

Requirements: UC transferable GPA 3.2-3.3 depending on major. Major guaranteed provided all TAG requirements are completed.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, IRVINE

Requirements: UC transferable GPA of 3.2. Major guaranteed provided all TAG requirements are completed.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, MERCED

Requirements: UC Transferable GPA of 2.8-3.0 depending on major. Major guaranteed provided all TAG requirements are completed.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, RIVERSIDE

Requirements: UC Transferable GPA of 3.0. Major guaranteed provided all TAG requirements are completed.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, SAN DIEGO

Requirements: UC Transferable GPA of 3.5 and full IGETC Certification by end of Spring prior to transfer. Major is NOT guaranteed.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, SANTA BARBARA

Requirements: UC Transferable GPA of 3.2. Major guaranteed for College of Engineering; Major NOT guaranteed in the College of Letters and Sciences

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, SANTA CRUZ

Requirements: UC Transferable GPA of 3.0. Major guaranteed for the Jack Baskin School of Engineering; All other majors NOT guaranteed

California State University

CAL STATE UNIVERSITY EAST BAY

Priority deadline - October/November for fall; August for spring. Requirements: minimum of 60 CSU transferable units & 2.0 GPA at time of transfer. Certain majors require higher GPAs. Go to: assist.org

SAN FRANCISCO STATE UNIVERSITY

Priority deadline - October/November for fall; August for spring. Requirements: minimum of 60 CSU transferable units & 2.0 GPA at time of transfer. Certain majors require higher GPAs. Go to: assist.org

Private Universities and Colleges

SANTA CLARA UNIVERSITY

Priority deadline - March. Requirements: minimum of 30 transferable units; minimum GPA of 3.3 for arts and sciences and engineering and a minimum GPA of 3.5 for business.

UNIVERSITY OF SAN FRANCISCO (USF)

Priority deadline - Before application filing period. Requirements: minimum of 30 transferable units to sign agreement; transferable GPA of 2.5.

NOTRE DAME DE NAMUR UNIVERSITY

Priority deadline - Before application filing period. Requirements: minimum of 30 transferable units to sign agreement; transferable GPA of 2.5.

MENLO COLLEGE

Priority deadline - Before application filing period. Requirements: minimum of 30 transferable units to sign agreement; transferable GPA of 2.5.

GOLDEN GATE UNIVERSITY &

BETHANY UNIVERSITY

Priority deadlines - Before April & December (Golden Gate); July & December (Bethany). Requirements: minimum of 30 transferable units to sign agreement; transferable GPA of 2.0. Scholarships available to students who have transferable GPA of 2.75 (Golden Gate) & 2.8 (Bethany).

UNIVERSITY OF THE PACIFIC

Priority deadline - February 1 for fall; July 1 for spring. Requirements: minimum of 30 transferable units to sign agreement; transferable GPA of 3.0.

DEVRY UNIVERSITY

Requirements: 12 transfer units with a grade of C or better and fulfillment of DeVry University's English and math entrance requirements. Additionally scholarships are available to those who qualify, including the Community College Scholarship and Transfer Scholarship. Requirements: 60 transferable units with a 2.0 GPA Complete the CSU GE Breadth or IGETC Requirements
