Welcome Dependents of Veterans!

Children or a spouse of a veteran who died or is permanently and totally disabled as a result of a service-connected disability may be eligible for the Educational Assistance Program. To apply, you'll need complete the VA form 22-5490. The process for certification of classes for this benefit is the same as for veterans collecting on the GI Bill.

Children or a spouse of a veteran who has a service connected disability or who has died of service-related causes may also qualify for a college fee waiver program. See a CSM certifying official for more information.
