- **◆16th graduating Class in May**
- ◆Middle College originated in NY, 1974
- ◆One of 25 member schools in the Middle College Consortium (Dallas, Chicago, Memphis, LA); also at Cañada, Foothill, DeAnza colleges





- SMUHSD Alternative education program
- High school and college courses for credit
- Flexible scheduling
- Explore individual interests/career paths
- ♦ No tuition (<11.5 units)
 - Students pay for parking
 - Family pays for books, unless financial need



- ♦30 juniors and 30 seniors
- Students reside in SMUHSD and CUSD
- Academically capable
- Plans to complete high school
- Should be close to graduating on time
- ◆ At-risk students
- Students not interested in high school activities

- ◆a 50-minute Advisory class


Students also take college courses to meet high school graduation requirements (at least 7 units; no more than 11.5 units)
