CSM EMAIL ACCOUNTS

All MCHS students have been assigned a CSM email account, which ends in @my.smccd.edu If students have not logged in, they should do so immediately. Students can link their current email account to the my.smccd.edu account. Important CSM information is sent to students, including upcoming events and status on wait lists. Go to http://mv.smccd.edu for details and login.

✓ FEES FOR FALL 2014

CSM and the San Mateo County Community College District are required to charge fees for high school students who are taking 11.5 or more college units in one semester. Such a student is referred to as a "special admit full-time student." Students enrolled in 11.5 or more units are charged the full fee of \$46 per unit for every unit the student is enrolled in.

Students enrolled in 11.5 or more units by the start of the semester must drop below 11.5 units before the final day to drop classes (usually two weeks after the first day of the semester) to avoid being charged for the units. (Consult the class schedule for the exact dates.)

Students who want to take 11.5 or more units may do so with the permission of the Middle College administrator or counselor. Full-time college students typically take between 12 and 15 college units. Middle College students enrolled in 11.5 or more college units, in addition to their three high school classes, are taking on a heavy academic load and responsibility.

✓ SAT/ACT REGISTRATION

✓ FINAL EXAMS, DEC. 18-19

Reminder that the Middle College final exams are Thursday and Friday, Dec. 18 and Dec. 19 from 11:10-1:40pm. College finals begin Saturday, Dec. 13 and run through Dec. 19. Middle College students must attend the high school final exams. Vacation begins Dec. 20; school resumes Tuesday, Jan. 14.

CRER 122 CLASS

Middle College students are required to pass CRER 121 and CRER 122 to meet a MCHS requirement. The eight-week CRER 122 class. "Planning for Student Success," begins on Tuesday, Aug. 19, 11:10-noon in Bldg. 16, room 140. The class meets Tuesdays and Thursdays and runs until mid-October.

✓ SENIORS INTERNSHIPS

Seniors must meet with senior advisor Mr. Clardy to plan for their senior internship. Some seniors began their assignments this summer. Seniors are required to put in 24 hours in a career-related field. This experience is the basis for the mandatory Senior Project, completed mid-spring. MIDDLE COLLEGE TEXTBOOK POLICY

The high school textbooks used by Middle College students will be checked out to the student during the school year. Students are expected to take good care of the textbooks and return the textbooks to the Middle College staff members by the conclusion of the course. Students who do not return the textbooks or who damage high school textbooks will be responsible for paying for a replacement textbook.

Middle College requires that students purchase their own college textbooks from the CSM Bookstore or from an on-line textbook service. Students will be able to write in and highlight in the books as needed, and later resell the textbook to the CSM bookstore or to an online business for a portion of the original purchase price. Students also can rent books from the CSM Bookstore. Many college students keep their college textbooks and use the books as a resource either for other courses or for occupational experiences.



Middle College has set up an account to help purchase textbooks for students with a financial need. Students who need financial assistance for textbook costs can complete a rationale for fee waiver. See the administrator for more information. These textbooks remain property of the SMUHSD and Middle College. Students who do not return these textbooks or who damage them will be responsible for paying for a replacement textbook. Student may not write in or deface the textbooks in any way.

The following guidelines have been established for Middle College students who need the program to purchase some or all of the college books:

• Books for dropped or withdrawn classes must be returned within first two weeks of the semester or student is responsible for purchase price of the book.

• Students are responsible for the cost of books in courses in which they receive an F or a non-credit grade.

Students are responsible for paying for study guides, workbooks, solution manuals, course syllabi, class supplies or materials, other disposable items, and other non-textbook items.

Student ID Pictures

Middle College doesn't have a scheduled day for student photos. Our students can return to their home school to have an individual picture taken, both for the yearbook and for their ID card. Call the home schools for more details.

Middle College students are eligible to get a CSM photo ID. Students must pay an \$8 Student Body Fee to the CSM Cashier's Office, then go to the Student Life Center in Bldg. 17 to get the photo taken. Students can do this when school begins on August 12.
