I hope I can give you the information you require.

- 1) As I meet with each student for an exit interview at the completion of the second semester of the Field Studies/Seminar Class (Internship). 90% are employed in clinics in San Mateo County, San Francisco and throughout the East Bay.
- 2) 10% will continue to be permanent volunteers in clinics throughout the Bay Area.
- 3) 100% complete a state exam after completing 2000 plus Internship hours to become State Certified.
- 4) 60% continue to achieve an A. A. degree.
- 5) 45% are continuing to achieve a BA degree.
- 6) 15% achieve a MA degree.
- 7) 1% have achieved a PHD.degree.

We have a shortage of Certified Addiction Counselors, therefore, many students are employed during their course of study. If an Intern proves to be an asset in the clinics, they are employed part-time until they complete their courses and achieve Certification.

I make 2 on-site clinic visits each semester during a student's internship/internships, to meet with the Clinical Supervisors as a continual evaluation process of the CSM Interns.
