<p>➤ Nursing Program Updates</p>	Melissa	<p>*All information is tentative at the moment, will be confirmed over summer, but please do not distribute to students*</p> <p>1st step for a CSM nursing student: please attend one mandatory workshop (not considered if they don't attend). In January, usually have an online workshop for distance applicants. Advise them to go to most updated workshop. Currently do not need to RSVP. Only offered in Fall semester.</p> <p>2nd step: double check all required prereqs.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Math 200 (now required). (NOT Psyc 121) • Engl 100/105 • Psyc 100 • Psyc 200 (NOT child development) • Chem 410 • Comm 110 or 130 • Soci 100 (preferred) or Anth 110 • Biol 240 • Biol 250 • Biol 260 	

		<p>2019 admissions Biol 240, 250, 260 GPA is 3.5 and above. Bachelor's programs avg 3.9.</p> <p>2.5 GPA in 3 Biols, 2.5 GPA in all prerequisites to be considered, but not necessarily competitive.</p> <p>Prerequisite policy: Even with recency, many schools can disqualify students who take a class w C or higher grade. No more than 2 attempts for each Biol class (W do not count as an attempt). If any Biol course is repeated, 2 pts are deducted.</p> <p>All official college transcript required to apply.</p> <p>All courses must be completed by Feb 1st EXCEPT 1 class from Comm, Soci/Anth, but need to see it is In Progress, must be completed by Fall. No points awarded for honors or AP.</p> <p>Any courses outside of SMCCD need to be evaluated. Any course not in articulation list must submit Nursing Dept Prerequisite Evaluation Form. DEADLINE: January 6th to allow for up to 3 week evaluation time. Will not be accepted over email. DO NOT ACCEPT ETRANSCRIPTS OVER EMAIL, BUT PRINTOUT IS OK.</p> <p>If they have transcripts evaluated by TES, they still have to go through Nursing prerequisite evaluation. To use coursework for an AA degree, still need to go through TES (but suggest waiting until they are admitted unless they need it for a</p>	
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	<p>degree)</p> <p>Nursing Articulation Grid form will be moved to homepage.</p> <p>Merit Based Criteria form:</p> <p>The more points an applicant has, higher they are on the list, top 50 are admitted. Can get up to 115 points.</p> <p>Part 1: 5 pts max. Having an AA gives points, doesn't have to be health related (so Social Science AA is ok – most will qualify for it)</p> <p>Part 2: 16 pts max.</p> <p>2C – direct patient care – front desk doesn't count, correct?</p> <p>2E – 50 health care volunteer hours in last 5 yrs (hospital, in home care)</p> <p>3A – All Biol courses must be taken after Jan 1 2015 to count as an attempt</p> <p>3B – AP Psyc accepted, AP English – will need to check w program.</p> <p>Overall GPA avg is 3.7</p> <p>3C – 4 pts max for Medical Terminology, Pharmacology, Humanities or US Govt (recommend US 1/2/3, but not required), Nutrition</p> <p>Area 4 – 4 pts max, anything that requires an explanation, just 1-3 sentences on it.</p> <p>Area 6 – can read, write, and speak another language – need to submit a form to verify, can have someone in</p>	
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	<p>a professional capacity to verify</p> <p>Area 7: TEAS/HESI. REQUIRED to apply with TEAS or HESI. 2021 forward will only be the HESI (along w most nursing programs in the state). TEAS is more general. HESI is very nursing focused. HESI needs to be 70% or higher (80% or higher is better), no more than 2 attempts, same scale as listed for TEAS. Finish the Biol classes before taking the exam. HESI is offered very frequently, for TEAS closest location is Sunnyvale, recommend studying 3 months in advance (CSUEB has an in person study prep broken down by area; Ohlone also has test prep, but costs \$110)</p> <p>NEW SECTION: 8 – Personal Insight Questions (mostly used to evaluate clear writing and speak to why a student is interested in nursing) – need to speak here to CSM specifically</p> <p>Nursing CAS – \$50/app, looking into potential for financial aid. Feb 1, 4pm</p> <p>Admissions decisions usually out by late April</p> <hr/> <p>Summary of Changes: Stats required, official transcripts required, TEAS/HHESI required at application, Biol recency, W in Biol classes no longer count as attempts, volunteer hours now 50, nutrition now accepted, personal statement required</p> <p>For LVN – merit based, resume and</p>	
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		<p>personal statements required. BUT LVN program did not have any spots, so encourage them to do prereqs and apply to 2 year programs</p> <p>SFSU ADN to BSN bridge program: open to CSM nursing students or alumni</p> <p>Need Engl 110/165, 3.0 GPA in nursing prerequisites, can't apply with over 70 transferable units to bridge, but can to ASN or BSN at SFSU</p> <p>SFSU contact is Catherine Midden (midden@sfsu.edu)</p> <p>Never actually set foot at SFSU. Issue is financial aid bc being seen as 2 separate schools</p>
