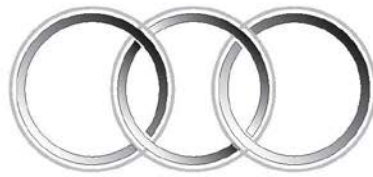

KEYNOTE SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES

Frank Harris



Dr. Frank Harris III is a professor of postsecondary education and Co-Director of the Community College Equity Assessment Lab (CCEAL) at San Diego State University. He is best known for his expertise in racial [in] equity in postsecondary education and has made important contributions to knowledge about college student development and the social construction of gender and race in college contexts. His work prioritizes populations that have been historically underrepresented and underserved in education.

Dr. Harris's scholarship has been published in leading journals for higher education and student affairs research and practice. He has also delivered more than 500 academic and professional presentations throughout his career. His commentary has been sought by several high-profile media outlets, including *CNN*, *The New York Times*, *The Los Angeles Times*, and *The Chronicle of Higher Education*, to name a few.

Before joining the faculty at San Diego State, Dr. Harris worked as a student affairs educator and college administrator in the areas of student affairs administration, student crisis support and advocacy, new student orientation programs, multicultural student affairs, academic advising, and enrollment services. He also served as an adjunct professor of speech communication at Los Angeles Trade Technical College. Harris earned a bachelor's degree in communication studies at Loyola Marymount University, a master's degree in speech communication at California State University Northridge, and a doctorate in higher education from the Rossier School of Education at the University of Southern California.

Tom Ammiano



Tom Ammiano is a long-time San Francisco leader who served the city for nearly three decades as a teacher, civil rights leader, educator, Supervisor and Assemblymember.

A native of New Jersey, Mr. Ammiano earned his B.A. from Seton Hall and his Master's Degree in special education from San Francisco State University. He taught English to children in South Vietnam as part of a Quaker program until 1968, when he returned to San Francisco to become a public school teacher shortly after the Tet Offensive.

Mr. Ammiano was elected to the San Francisco School Board in 1990, where he served until 1994 and was elected President of the School Board. In 1994, Mr. Ammiano won citywide election to the San Francisco Board of Supervisors. In 2000, after the institution of district elections, he was elected District 9 Supervisor, and he represented the Mission District, Bernal Heights and Portola neighborhoods. He was elected to the California State Assembly in 2008 and served until 2014.

Mr. Ammiano served as President of the Board of Supervisors from 1998 to 2002. In addition to serving on the Board, he served on the Golden Gate Bridge Board and the Metropolitan Transportation Commission. In the Assembly, Mr. Ammiano served as chair of the Assembly Public Safety Committee as well as chair of the LGBT Caucus. Recently, he was a lecturer at Skyline College.

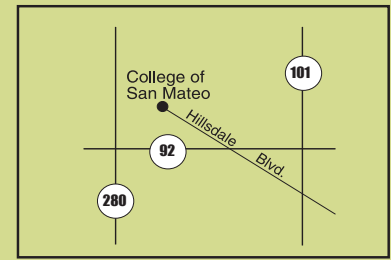
Valid CA Disabled Person placard only. No student, staff, daily, patron or visitor parking permit required when displaying a valid CA DP placard.
