

1. Change to program review due date for library studies

The library has requested to change the due date of their program review, **from Fall 2025 to Fall 2026**. This will allow the library to do an SLO analysis of the Library Studies program to help align the Library Studies Program Review with revisions that they will need to make to the Course Outline of Record for LIBR 100 in the Curriculum Committee.
