Dear Members of Congress,

On behalf of the Associated Students of College of San Mateo (ASCSM), we are writing to voice our support for the Equality Act (H.R. 5). Our mission as student leaders is to unapologetically advocate for equity and inclusion for our hyper-marginalized students. As we have been working to implement culturally responsive and equity-based education and leadership on and off campus, we are devoted to supporting legislation that safeguard the civil rights and individual liberties of all individuals.

As a student government based on activism and social justice beliefs, we have an ethical and moral obligation to strive for a society that secures all people's humanity. Every person, regardless of sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression, has the right to live without fear of persecution, harassment, or discrimination. Based on our principles as student leaders, we must advocate complete equality for the LGBTQIA+ community. Our endorsement was impacted and influenced by the "Don't Say Gay Bill" in Florida and other states. We feel strongly that this legislation – and similar bills being introduced across the country – must be stopped. These bills not only infringe on freedom of speech and privacy, but they also threaten the mental health and well-being of LGBTQ+ youth and families. The Associated Students of College of San Mateo truly believe that all individuals, regardless of gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression, have the right to live free from fear and persecution.

As Section 2b of the Equity Act states, we are committed to protect our community against discrimination on the basis of all characteristics. We have all come this far to make a difference in our community. We are asking you to take into consideration the hard work, testimonies, and healing we all have been through. This is the time to protect our

community, especially our youth, who are the key to a bright and peaceful future. We believe our generation deserves to feel safe and protected. As the Associated Students of College of San Mateo, will continue to provide resources and support so our community may feel safe and heard. We will also continue to devote resources to advocating for the equality of all people.
