DESCRIPTION

DESCRIPTION

To celebrate Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month (celebrated throughout the entirety of May), the Cultural Awareness Board will be working in collaboration with CSM's Asian American and Pacific Islander Leadership Program to host a movie screening of the film, 'Turning Red' (PG) for educational purposes. This film follows a 13-year-old Chinese-Canadian girl named Mei Lee and showcases Chinese cultural representation through various themes within the film.

This event will take place on Friday, May 13th, between the hours of 5:30 pm and 8 pm. We will be serving three "main entree" finger foods from three different AAPI cultures and a variety of snacks from other AAPI cultures. Our three main dishes will be Lumpia (Philippines), Samosas (India), and Onigiri (Japan). We will also be handing out boba to the first 40 students (catered from Urban Ritual), and little bags with fun, culturally significant goodies (ie. origami paper with origami instructions, fortune cookies, good luck charms, etc).

Cultural Awareness will be in charge of creating educational and informational posters that will explain the significance of AAPI Heritage Month, why it is recognized, and how it is celebrated by various AAPI cultures. We will also be noting and recognizing the different AAPI cultures that are categorized under the umbrella term 'AAPI'.

The funding will include the costs of facilities, food + snacks, boba, decorations, and goodie bag items.
