REPORTS

Vice Chair Petelo reminded anyone involved with a campus club to turn in their Club Information Packet for the fall semester. She also reminded the group that the Inter Club Council (ICC) meets on Tuesdays at 1:15 p.m. in Building 18, Room 308.

Mr. Schaefer reviewed the ASCSM Office Rules, which were distributed to the Student Senate. He asked that any guests or visitors wait outside the office until a member of the Student Senate is present. He also reminded the group to have guests and visitors sign-in when using the space.

Mr. Hamadeh announced that Public Safety has reinstituted the parking permit requirement for anyone parked in a staff lot. Permits are still not required in student and visitor lots. Public Safety is currently issuing warning citations. Official parking tickets will be issued starting September 15.

Ms. Bathai said that new bivalent COVID-19 booster shots are now available to the public. It is expected that the District vaccination sites will reopen soon to start distributing the shots.

Vice President of Student Services Moon-Johnson said that the administration is soliciting input regarding naming the outdoor patio spaces in College Center Building 10. He asked that any suggestions be routed to him or Director of Marketing David McLain.

APPOINTMENTS

FUNDING FOR CAMPUS SPEAKER

Professor Tim Maxwell and Director of Equity David Galvez said that they are interested in bringing author Tommy Orange to campus. Professor Maxwell and several other English professors are teaching Mr. Orange's book, *There There*, this semester. Mr. Orange was born in Oakland and currently resides in the Central Valley. The book follows a large cast of Native Americans living in the Oakland area and contains several essays on Native American history and identity. Brining Mr. Orange to campus would be a great opportunity to present a local author and community activist. The funding being requested will support bringing Mr. Orange to CSM for a presentation and discussion. The Office of Equity will be providing \$3,000.00 in funding, for a total offer of \$11,000.00.

Motion to approve allocating \$8,000.00 from the Ethnic Cultural Affairs account (#5050) to support brining author Tommy Orange to campus by Senator Bao; seconded by Senator Myat. The motion carried with 10 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining.

FUNDING FOR FOOD FOR HEALTH FAIR

On behalf of the CSM Wellness Center, Mr. Hamadeh presented a request to provide support for the annual Health Fair. Due to the suspension of the Student Health Services Fee by the Board of Trustees, the Wellness Center does not have the funding to provide the usual food for the exhibitors and attendees. Therefore, the Wellness Center is requesting support from the Student Senate to cover this expense.

Motion to approve allocating \$2,500.00 from the College Program Assistance account (#5032) to support the annual Health Fair on Wednesday, October 26, 2022, by Senator Palomar; seconded by Senator Bao. The motion carried with 10 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining.

FUNDING FOR DISTRICT STUDENT COUNCIL MIXER

On behalf of Student Trustee Ta, Mr. Hamadeh explained that the District Student Council (DSC) sponsors a mixer with the student governments from Cañada, CSM, and Skyline. This semester, Skyline will be hosting the event. DSC is requesting that each student government provide \$400.00 to support the mixer, for a total of \$1,200.00. The group is also asking for feedback on possible dates for the event. The possible dates are Friday, October 28; Friday, November 4; and Friday, November 18.

Motion to approve \$400.00 from the Hospitality account (#5080) to support the DSC Mixer by Senator Dhillon; seconded by Senator Shive. The motion carried with 10 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining.

Members of the Student Senate indicated that Friday, November 4, is their preferred date for the mixer.

DESIGNATION OF KEY ACCOUNT EXECUTIVES FOR ASCSM WELLS FARGO BANK ACCOUNT

Wells Fargo requires that the Associated Students designate key account executives for the accounts housed at their institution. It has been several years since the key account executives were updated. All three student governments must designate a key account executive and provide a copy of the approved minutes from a meeting reflecting the change. The

Center for Student Life is recommending that the Student Senate remove Henry Villareal and Robin Richards as the current key account executives and designate Dr. Jennifer Taylor-Mendoza and Dr. Joshua Moon-Johnson as the new key account executives.

Motion to remove Henry Villareal and Robin Richards as the current key account executives and designate Dr. Jennifer Taylor-Mendoza and Dr. Joshua Moon-Johnson as the new key account executives for the ASCSM accounts with Wells Fargo by Senator Dhillon; seconded by Senator Stonehewer Bird. The motion carried with 10 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining.

CSM COMMUNITY RELATIONS AND MARKETING

CSM Director of Community Relations and Marketing David McLain and Communications Manager Jonathan Wax provided an overview of the role and responsibilities of the Community Relations and Marketing Department. Mr. Wax said that the department is looking for a student assist with development of material for social media, especially video for platforms like Instagram and TikTok. Community Relations and Marketing would like to hire a student assistant for 10 to 15 hours per week to help highlight campus life, including events and activities sponsored by the Associated Students and clubs and organizations.
