APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Motion to approve the agenda as presented by Senator Dhillon; seconded by Senator Ferreira. Hearing no objections, the motion carried.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF PRIOR MEETINGS

Motion to approve the minutes of the November 7, 2022, meeting by Senator Palomar; seconded by Senator Ferreira. Hearing no objections, the motion carried.

ANNOUNCEMENTS AND HEARINGS OF THE PUBLIC

None.

Hearing no objections, the Student Senate suspended the order of the day and took up the following items: Update on Spring 2023 Class Schedule and Student Input on Class Modalities and Implementation of SB 893.

UPDATE ON SPRING 2023 CLASS SCHEDULE AND STUDENT INPUT ON CLASS MODALITIES

CSM Interim Vice President of Instruction Carla Grandy provided the Student Senate with an update on the class schedule for the Spring 2023 semester. She noted that 70% of the classes offered during the spring semester will be offered in-person with 30% offered online. The College did see a slight increase in demand for online classes for the Fall 2022 semester, but students are continuing to return to campus. Vice President Grandy said that in a District survey focused on transportation, 50% percent of respondents expressed a desire for a full in-person campus experience and 20% expressed a preference for a fully online experience.

Vice President Grandy said that the College is still exploring the best ways to respond to student needs when it comes to class modalities and scheduling. She noted that divisions have come up with different

methods for tracking requests for additional sections, including an online spreadsheet and other ad hoc methods. Ms. Grandy said that in response to student demand, the Language Arts Division added almost a dozen new sections after the start of the Fall 2022 semester. Vice President Grandy asked for feedback from the Student Senate on the best way to get input from students regarding desired class scheduling. Members of the Student Senate said that the College should develop a formalized process for students to request additional sections. They also said that the College should look at balancing the in-person, hybrid, and online offerings so that students can take advantage of the modality that works best for them.

Vice President Grandy thanked the Student Senate for their input and said that she would return at a future meeting to continue the discussion.

IMPLEMENTATION OF SB 893

SMCCCD Trustee John Pimentel thanked the Student Senate for supporting SB 893, which will allow the District offer free classes to residents of San Mateo County starting in Spring 2023. Trustee Pimentel asked members of the Student Senate for input on how to best market and promote this opportunity. Members of the Student Senate suggested conducting direct outreach in the community, particularly to groups who may not have been marketed to in the past. They also suggested promoting the College's unique programs, such as learning communities and student organizations, as well as its student support and instructional services. Several members of the Senate shared that direct outreach by programs such as EOPS or Promise Scholars during high school was extremely beneficial. Members of the Senate said that the stories of key influencers and role models in their lives who attended community college were also a driving factor in their decision to attend CSM.

Trustee Pimentel thanked the Student Senate for their input and shared his own experience of attending a California community college, which led him to attending Harvard Business School and UC Berkeley. He encouraged members of the Student Senate to continue their leadership beyond their time at CSM.

At the conclusion of this item, the Student Senate resumed the order of the day.

REPORTS

President Morales reminded members of the Senate to attend and support the LGBTQ+ "Dragtastic" event tomorrow starting at 11:30 a.m. in the Bayview Dining Room.

Vice President Ferreira echoed President Morales' statement and said that the Cultural Awareness Board had put a lot of work into the event.

Finance Director Tagashira said that the Student Senate has allocated approximately \$83,000 in funding for the fall semester, leaving approximately \$82,000 for the spring semester. Mr. Schaefer and Mr. Hamadeh said that a detailed budget update with actual expenditures and income would be presented to the Senate at the end of the fall semester or early in the spring.

Student Trustee Ta reported that she had secured a commitment from the Foundation to support paying students for participatory governance meetings starting in the spring semester.

Senator Dhillon said that the Advocacy Board's survey event would be moved to early December.

Senator Chang encouraged everyone to participate in tomorrow's "Dragtastic" event.

Student Life and Leadership Manager Schaefer reported that the event with author Tommy Orange is going to be rescheduled for the spring semester, likely sometime in April. Mr. Schaefer said that there were unexpected challenges with the contract that necessitated moving the event.

Student Life and Leadership Assistant Hamadeh announced that there will be no ICC meeting tomorrow, Tuesday, November 15. He also said that barring an urgent need there will be no Student Senate meeting on Monday, November 21.

Student Life and Leadership Staff Assistant Bathai encouraged everyone to attend both the International Education Week events taking place this week and the ASCSM/SparkPoint Community Meal next week.

FUNDING FOR BOBA EMPOWERING BROTHERS EVENT

The Brothers Empowering Brothers (BEB) club is requesting \$1,000.00 in funding for an event to build awareness of the group. Building on a similar successful event last spring, the club would like to offer boba and donuts to students. ICC unanimously recommended approval of the funding.

Motion to allocate \$1,000.00 from the Club Assistance/ICC account (#5031) to support the Boba Empowering Brothers event organized by BEB by Senator Budiman; seconded by Senator Palomar. The motion was carried unanimously with 13 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining.

FUNDING FOR THANKSGIVING POTLUCK

The EOPS Club is requesting \$1,000.00 to support a Thanksgiving event for members of the club and invited guests. The event is intended as a show of thanks for the hard work the club members have put in this semester. ICC unanimously recommended approval of the funding.

Motion to allocate \$1,000.00 from the Club Assistance/ICC account (#5031) to support the EOPS Club Thanksgiving potluck by Senator Shive; seconded by Senator Ferreira. The motion was carried unanimously with 13 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining.

FUNDING FOR INCENTIVES FOR CSM CAFETERIA MENU SURVEY

Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) is requesting funding to provide incentives to students for completing a survey meant to gather opinions on the cafeteria food at CSM. The survey will take place Tuesday, November 15, and Wednesday, November 16. The requested funds are to provide gift cards and a pizza to help incentivize students to take the survey. ICC unanimously recommended approval of the funding.

Motion to allocate \$410.00 from the Club Assistance/ICC account (#5031) to fund incentives for the PTK CSM cafeteria menu survey by Senator Ferreira; seconded by Senate Myat. The motion was carried unanimously with 13 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining.

FUNDING FOR STRESS-LESS WEEK EVENT

The Active Minds club is requesting funding for Stress Less Week, a week of events meant to decrease stress and encourage wellness prior to finals. The event will be from Monday, November 28, through Friday, December 2. It will include events and activities such as slime making, a de-stress wall, games, snacks, and therapy dogs. ICC unanimously recommended approval of the funding.

Motion to allocate \$1,300.00 from the Club Assistance/ICC account (#5031) for the Active Minds Stress-Less Week event by Senator Palomar; seconded by Senator Dhillon. The motion was carried unanimously with 13 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining.

FUNDING FOR ASCSM/SPARKPOINT COMMUNITY MEAL EVENT

The Programming Board will be partnering with the SparkPoint program to offer a community meal for anyone who is on campus on Tuesday, November 22. The meal will be an opportunity for the campus community to come together, participate in ice breakers and games, and learn about food insecurity, food justice, and the role food plays in culture.

Motion to allocated \$10,000.00 from the Programs account (#5150) for the joint ASCSM/SparkPoint community meal by Senator Stonehewer Bird; seconded by Senator Chang. The motion was carried unanimously with 13 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining.

ADOPTION OF NEW ASCSM LOGO

On behalf of the Public Relations Board, Senator Shive presented six options to update and refresh the ASCSM logo. After review, the Student Senate recommended three for further refinement and possible adoption. Mr. Schaefer noted that updating the logo would be a multistep process that would also need to involve the College's Community Relations and Marketing Department.
