REPORTS

President Morales welcomed everyone back for the Spring 2023 semester. She said that the Winter Leadership Retreat went well, and that she is looking forward to what the group can accomplish during the spring semester.

Vice President Ferreira echoed President Morales' welcome and said that he enjoyed the Winter Leadership Retreat.

Vice Chair Jane Petelo encouraged anyone involved with student clubs and organizations to submit an updated Club Information Packet for the Spring 2023 semester.
