APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Motion to approve the agenda as presented by Senator Aguilar; seconded by Senator Ferreira. Hearing no objections, the motion carried.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF PRIOR MEETING(S)

Motion to approve the minutes of the January 23, 2023, meeting as presented by Senator Dhillon; seconded by Senator Bao. Hearing no objections, the motion carried.

ANNOUNCEMENTS AND HEARINGS OF THE PUBLIC

REPORTS

Vice Chair Jane Petelo reported that the first ICC meeting will be held tomorrow, Tuesday, January 31, Building 18, Room 308 from 1:15 p.m. to 2:15 p.m.

Secretary Jacob Stattenfield announced the upcoming coat drive, which is a collaboration between the Volunteer Club and the Cultural Awareness Board. Mr. Stattenfield asked members to spread the word about the drive.

Senator Amrit Dhillon reported that the Committee on Teaching and Learning (CTL) members discussed equity gaps in district policy and professional development.

Senator Carissa Chang reported that the Cultural Awareness Board's Lunar New Year event will take place tomorrow inside Building 10. The coat drive that Secretary Stattenfield mentioned earlier is connected to the event and will run until Thursday.

Vice President of Student Services Joshua Moon-Johnson reported that at its last meeting, the Board of Trustees discussed compensating students for serving on college and district committees. Dr. Moon-Johnson said that CSM is planning to move forward with a plan to pay students for committee work. He is working with Mr. Schaefer and Mr. Hamadeh to establish a system this semester.

Vice President Moon-Johnson sought to clarify the details of the Free College for San Mateo County residents that started this semester. He said that some students are eligible to have all their fees and tuition completely covered while some may only have tuition covered. Dr. Moon-Johnson said that the Board of Trustees has authorized a program to distribute \$50 monthly gas gift cards to eligible students. Until that program launches, the Lyft program, which serves parts of the Coastside, the Belmont and San Carlos Caltrain stations, and the Hayward and South Hayward BART stations, is an option for students.

Finally, Dr. Moon-Johnson introduced Gulnazik Bakhramova, a new Student Fellow in the office of the Vice President of Student Services. Ms. Bakhramova will be creating a campaign on social media called "Insider," designed to help CSM students feel included.

Student Life and Leadership Manager Aaron Schaefer announced that he will be in all-day training sessions on Tuesday and Wednesday this week, making him unavailable in person until Thursday. Anyone who may need to get in touch with him should reach out via text or email.

Student Life and Leadership Assistant Fauzi Hamadeh asked that the Student Senate help with the upcoming events in any way they can. He also reported that today is the last day of the add/drop period for the Spring 2023 semester.

Student Life and Leadership Staff Assistant Mondana Bathai reported that there is a community lantern floating event that will be held Monday, February 6, from 11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the reflecting pools in front of the Library building. She encouraged members to attend if possible. The lanterns represent letting go of misfortune and sadness.

FUNDING FOR FOOD FOR SPRING 2023 HEALTH FAIR

On behalf of the CSM Wellness Center, Mr. Hamadeh said that the spring Health Fair will take place on Wednesday, March 22, 2023. Like last semester, the Wellness Center is seeking support to provide refreshments for the exhibitors and students attending the fair.

Motion to approve \$2,500.00 from the College Program Assistance account (#5032) to support food for the Spring 2023 Club Fair by Vice Chair Jane Petelo, seconded by Senator Ferreira. The motion carried unanimously with 12 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining.

FUNDING FOR LERONE MARTIN LUNCHEON

CSM Prof. David Laderman requested funding for a luncheon to be held after the keynote presentation by Lerone Martin, professor of Religious Studies and Director of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Research and Education Institute at Stanford University. Dr. Martin will be on campus to engage in a compelling

discussion of the history of white nationalism and the FBI, the vital importance of historical studies for today's culture and activism, and potential partnerships between Stanford and CSM. The presentation will be held on Wednesday, February 15, at 11 a.m. in the CSM Theatre. Afterwards, the reception will be held with Dr. Martin for invited students, faculty, staff, and administrators.

Motion to approve \$1,500.00 from the Ethnic and Cultural Affairs account (#5050) to support a luncheon reception with Dr. Lerone Martin on Wednesday, February 15, 2023, by Senator Palomar, seconded by Senator Shive. The motion carried unanimously with 12 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining.

FUNDING FOR VALENTINE'S DAY

Senator Palomar explained that the Valentine's Day event would take place February 14 from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. The event will include card making, gift making, and free food and drinks. The Valentine's Day event will be held in collaboration with the first day of the spring Club Fair.

Motion to approve \$8,000.00 from the Programs account (#5150) to support the Valentine's Day event Senator Ferreira, seconded by Senator Aguilar. The motion carried unanimously with 12 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining.

ASCSM SPRING 2023 ELECTION TIMELINE

Student Life and Leadership Assistant Fauzi Hamadeh presented the draft timeline for the ASCSM Spring 2023 Election. This election will be held to fill seats for the 2023/2024 student government and to select a nominee for the position of District student trustee. The Center for Student Life is also planning to recommend an amendment to the ASCSM Constitution that will set a minimum number of senators.

Candidate packets will be available starting Monday, April 3; the Mandatory Candidates Meeting will take place on Friday, April 14; and online polls will be open from Tuesday, April 25, through Thursday, April 27. Results will be announced on Friday, April 28.

Motion to approve the proposed election timeline by Senator Budiman, seconded by Senator Myat. The motion carried unanimously with 12 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining.

ASCSM SPRING 2023 ELECTION COMMISSION

As a follow-up to the election timeline, Mr. Hamadeh stated that the ASCSM Constitution and Bylaws require establishment of an Election Commission to oversee the election process and adjudicate any serious violations or complaints. The Election Commission is comprised of four to five members fo the Student Senate who are not running in the election. It is customarily chaired by the ASCSM vice president unless they are planning to be a candidate in the election. Mr. Hamadeh asked that members consider serving on the Election Commission so that members may be named at the next meeting.




