DESCRIPTION

As part of our April SEAsian New Year activities, we will host a photo exhibit entitled "Life on the Border: Cambodian Exodus and the Reawakening of Dance." The photographer, Colin Grafton, is flying in from Cambodia and will talk on his experiences in the refugee camps on the Thai-Cambodia border after the Khmer Rouge genocide of 1975-1979. Approximately 90% of Cambodia's artists were killed during the genocide but a few survived and while in the refugee camps, began to practice and teach again. One of these artists is Charya Burt, who lives in the Bay Area and will come to present on her experiences as a dancer and how the arts can be used in healing trauma.

The benefits to CSM students include providing awareness about the background of many of our Southeast Asian student, who are both underrepresented and truthfully neglected in our CSM community. Without getting into too much detail, "Asian Americans" are often seen as the model minority, which ignores the nuances of experience, including the reasons for coming to the U.S.

This will be both a static (the photos) and an interactive (dance) workshop, and all are welcome -- faculty, staff, students, and community.

The total costs will be shared by the CSM AANAPISI grant and other funding sources for which I have applied, and include the following items not listed below: honorarium for master dancer Charya Burt (\$1000), transportation (flight) costs for Mr. Grifton (\$1000), printing of posters and fliers (\$200), equipment (easels, etc.) (\$400), and cost for use (facilities and custodial) of the Bayview Alcove OR 10-468, where the exhibit will be set up (\$2500+).

I am aware that all departments have budget limitations, and humbly submit this request with the knowledge that the entire amount may not be approved. But every little bit helps. I will bring fliers with event information to the Senate meeting.
