REPORTS

President Andrea Morales told the Student Senate that a group of international students had brainstormed ways to bring the issue of high tuition costs to the district. They plan on making a video to showcase the issue. Andrea was additionally planning on connecting with Skyline and Canada student bodies to speak to the district about the topic. Aaron weighed in, discussing how the sudden large jump in cost for international students was because the tuition cost for international students is supposed to increase annually, however it had not for the duration of the pandemic, leading to a sudden larger jump to compensate.

Finance Director Paola Tagashira announced that there will be an event in the library about informing people about Asian hate. The event will include food and giveaways.

Vice Chair Jane Petelo spoke about an upcoming event that will include food and showcase a speaker discussing his experience as a black American.

Senator Czar Ryan Palomar said that Spring Fling is coming up and he is asking for senators to attend the event to help set up.

Senator Michelle Aguilar discussed recent changes to math credits. High school math courses that match certain college courses can count in the same way as the corresponding college course towards earning an associate degree.

Student Life and Leadership Manager Aaron Schaefer congratulated everybody who was nominated and awarded in the leadership awards ceremony. He also asked for feedback and stated that new awards would be added next year. He also told clubs to elect their leadership this semester rather than next fall, as that helps clubs get off to a quick start in the fall. He added that paperwork for the next fall semester can be submitted now.

Student Life and Leadership Assistant Fauzi Hamadeh said he was close to sending out an email about participatory governance that will give students the opportunity to receive compensation for their time spent in participatory governance. To earn compensation, students who participated must provide which meetings they attended through meeting attendance sheets or other similar methods.

NON-RESIDENT TUITION FEE INCREASE FOR 2023-2024

The Student Senate discussed the recent increase in the tuition for international students and a way to advocate for a decrease or smaller increases in the tuition for international students. They also discussed the issue of hiring international students, which Senator Shive brought up often is difficult for on-campus employers because of the amount of paperwork involved.

SURVEY ON CAMPUS SPACE IMPROVEMENTS AND TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

Vice Chair Jane Petelo talked about a current survey for on transportation and the improvement of CSM campus spaces. The survey aims to think about how urban design affects mental wellness, thinking about adding social spaces where students could interact. On transportation, ideas such as having bike sharing or carpooling programs will be discussed in the survey.
