Bill Name	Pupil instruction: dual enrollment: College and Career Access Pathways partnership

Bill Sponsor(s)	Chris Holden
Purpose of Bill	This bill suggests creating partnerships between community colleges and schools to offer dual enrollment programs.
Bill Description	The State Department of Education and the California Community Colleges Chancellor's office would support these partnerships by providing technical assistance and services. The bill outlines the purposes of funding, which include identifying best practices, providing training for educators, developing a communication strategy, and offering resources and assistance. Schools and community colleges involved in these partnerships would report annually on their activities and outcomes. The bill's implementation is dependent on funding allocated by the Legislature.
Group(s) Impacted	High school students taking dual enrollment
Fiscal Impact (if any)	The bill would require the contracted entities to annually submit a report to the Legislature, the chancellor's office, the Superintendent of Public Instruction, and the Department of Finance that includes, among other requirements, the support and services provided for CCAP partnerships pursuant to these provisions. The bill would make the implementation of these provisions contingent upon an appropriation by the Legislature for these purposes.
