Bill Name	Improving Care for Vulnerable Older Citizens and People with Disabilities through Workforce Advancement Act of 2020

Purpose of Bill	To amend the Public Health Service Act to develop and test an expanded and advanced role for direct-care workers who provide long-term services and supports to older adults and people with disabilities in efforts to coordinate care and improve the efficiency of service delivery, and for other purposes.
Bill Description	This bill requires the Health Resources and Services Administration to award demonstration project grants to partnerships of health care providers, long-term care facilities, and other organisations to test models of care coordination and service delivery for older individuals, and individuals with disabilities, who have chronic illnesses or are at risk of institutional placement.
Group(s) Impacted	older adults, people with disabilities, direct care workforce
Last Action	December 31, 2020
Current Status	Referred to the House Committee on Energy and Commerce
Recommendation (Support, oppose, or watch? Why?)	Support. It would help develop the direct care workforce in order to improve the quality of care for older adults and people with disabilities, reduce costs for individuals and our health care system and finally reward direct care workers with the high-quality jobs they deserve. As preliminary research suggests that providing direct care workers with career advancement opportunities would improve an array of outcomes, with some studies indicating that these opportunities can increase job satisfaction and retention and reduce emergency room admissions and health care costs.
