FUNDING FOR CLUB OLYMPICS EVENT – PHI THETA KAPPA

Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) will be sponsoring a Club Olympics event so that the clubs and student organizations can interact with each other and build community. Various events will take place on the grass in front of College Center Building 10 on Monday, April 15. Food and drinks will also be provided.
