### APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Motion to approve the agenda as presented by Senator Han, seconded by Senator Zacarias. Hearing no objections, the motion was carried.

### **APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF PRIOR MEETING(S)**

Motion to approve the following corrections to the minutes of the October 14<sup>th</sup>, 2024, meeting by Senator Han; seconded by Senator Low.

Correction #1: Under Reports: Senator Low and Senator Zacarias, Student representatives of the Education Equality Committee, reported that EEC discussed to issues faced by students according to anti-racism surveys, and suggested goals for making the changes required based on the survey results. The further discussed ways to make hiring committees more equitable and making their meetings more student and public friendly to increase their attendance and involvement. There were also talks of renovating the official college website to make it more interactive and diverse.

Correction #2: Under Funding for UC Application Workshop: The was a misprint of the funding value approved and the same was corrected from \$450.00 to \$310.00.

Correction #3: Under Funding for Japanese Culture Exploration and Socializing: The was a misprint of the funding value allocated and the same was corrected from \$4,100.00 to \$940.00.

Hearing no objections, the motion to approve the minutes as corrected was carried.

### ANNOUNCEMENTS AND HEARINGS OF THE PUBLIC

No announcements were made.

#### REPORTS

President Vasquez urged the senators to sign up as volunteers for the two events that are hosted by Advocacy and Equity Affairs on October 15<sup>th</sup>. He asked the board chairs to encourage their board members to join. He also reported on the CSM Coast Side Ribbon Cutting Ceremony that would be taking place in Half Moon Bay, on Thursday, October 17th, to celebrate the opening of the new coast center that would be provided for students living in that area.

Vice-President Rysbekova requested the board chairs to encourage their board members to RSVP for the upcoming Leadership Retreat, that is open to all students on campus. This will be taking place on the weekend of November 1<sup>st</sup>.

Secretary Sharma apologized for the errors in the minutes of the previous meeting.

Senator Zacarias reported that a student wants to be more involved with their ceramic's studio and any suggestion on how to request longer lab time or after class open hours. He also mentioned that there were students who would appreciate to be able to use the computers in the library after library times, and if anything can be done for the same. He also wondered if there was any way to change the timings of operation for Building 17 too.

Senator Han, Board Chair of Equity Affairs, reminded that the Latino-Filipino Heritage Month Celebration would be tomorrow, October 15<sup>th</sup>, between 1:30pm and 3:00pm.

Senator Nyugen, Board Chair of Advocacy, brought up the "Ballot Box Ribbon Cutting Ceremony" that her board is hosting, on October 15<sup>th</sup> between 12 and 1pm. She also mentioned that Senator Situ, Vice Chair of Advocacy, has sent out volunteer links, and requested to sign up for the same.

Senator Han, Board Chair of Equity Affairs, reported that her board is hosting the Latino-Filipino Heritage Month on October 15<sup>th</sup> in Building 10, between 1 and 3pm, and invited the members of the Senate to stop by for the activities and food. She has also sent the sign-up forms across the group chats for those who can volunteer.

Mr. Hamadeh, the Student Life and Leadership Assistant, reported that Mr. Schaefer would be absent today. He also encouraged the senators and their board members to sign up for the upcoming events. He additionally brought up the Half Moon Bay ribbon cutting ceremony, as priorly mentioned by President Vasquez, and the Half Moon Bay Great Pumpkin Parade, which would be taking place on October 19<sup>th</sup>. The RSVP links for the latter have already been sent to the members of the Seante, and Mr. Hamadeh mentioned it would be great to have ASCSM be part of the parade too. He also clarified that there are no do-overs for any of the funding passed, so the members would have to be sure to only vote after they have a clear idea.

The Equity Affairs Board is hosting a Community Lights Festival to celebrate the different light festivals across various cultures together. This event is in collaboration with APACC.
