REPORTS

President Vasquez reported that the College President's cabinet had agreed to put up fliers with information pertaining to sexual harassment around the campus. There were also multiple scam emails sent out to the students on campus, so he advised the members to inform and be careful before clicking on any links in the emails.

Vice President Rysbekova reported from the District meeting that students can expect a change from our current OneLogin server to incorporate multi factor authentication as a default for all students, to secure student data better. Regarding the transport between the three campuses there is currently a lack of funding to purse the project individually, but it is being worked upon with the ongoing housing projects going on on the campuses. District Mixer will be taking place towards teh end of April - the date is TBD. Regarding updates about student employment paperwork processing, HR got back and mentioned that they had hired a new person just to process paperwork for student assistants/ interns on campus, making the process a lot more flexible and efficient than before – yay!

Vice Chair Llanell reported that he and his taskforce have finished planning for the valentines themed ICC club fair.

Secretary Sharma reported that Senators Oo and Llanell had cleaned the Senate office, as per their turn, and it will be Senators Zacarias and Batac who would be on cleaning duty the following Tuesday.

Senator Magidin reported that Academic Senate is in need of a Student Representative, as the previous Senators responsible for it cannot make it to the committee. This committee meets every 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month between 2:30 and 4:30 pm.

Senator Htet, Programming Board Chair, reported that his board had their second meeting of the semester and are currently planning a small event for the evening/ night students around Spring break before planning for Spring Fling.


