

DESCRIPTION
The event is being held in collaboration with the Equity Affairs board, Asian Pacific American Cultures and Community (APACC), and Chinese Student Scholar Association (CSSA) to celebrate the Mid-Autumn Festival, a traditional Chinese holiday that celebrates reunion.
