REPORTS

President Vasquez thanked all the Senators for their participation in the Senate throughout the year and congratulated those who were starting the next chapter of their lives after transferring He also gave a shoutout to Senators Llanell, Han, and Oo for their nominations for the leadership awards.

Vice President Rysbekova reported that the ASCSM Banquet would be at 2:15 pm next Monday. She is looking forward to seeing everyone there. The theme of the banquet is Graduation, mirroring the upcoming commencement. She also thanked everyone for all their contributions and commitment to coming to even the last meeting of the year.

Vice Chair Llanell reported that the ICC reception is tomorrow and everyone who's part of a club is welcome to join. It's going to be at 1:15 pm in Building 18, Room 308.

Mr. Guiriba, Vice President of Student Services:

- Gave everyone flowers and echoed what was previously mentioned: the engagement with students from this ASCSM is crazy one of the best we've ever seen ever at CSM
- Congratulated everyone on their academic achievement for earning their degrees and transferring
- Empathized that it is a stressful time with finals but also celebratory time (with World Gala, AAPILD Street Market, Commencement etc.)
- Reported that the Bookstore is trying something new: Students can buy their commencement cap, gown, and
 regalia and take pictures with the backdrop and props available in the Bookstore. The hope is that this becomes
 popular and will expand next year.

Mr. Schaefer, Student Life and Leadership Manager:

- Echoed Vice President Guiriba's comments about the level from student engagement. Mr. Schaefer said that there was a 20% increase in ASCSM and club events over the last year.
- Recommended keeping up connections with each other.
- Encouraged alumni to check in every so often and to stop by whenever possible.
- Said he would miss everyone from the Senate.

Mr. Hamadeh, Student Life and Leadership Assistant:

- Thanked everyone who showed up to the Campus Life and Leadership Awards.
- Recognized the cohesiveness of the group.
- Said there would be time for more sentimental stuff at next week's party.
- Thanked the group for all the work they have done at CSM and all the work they will do after CSM.
- Said it was a great experience working with the group.

FACILITIES MASTERPLAN PRESENTATION

Representatives from the Facilities Planning Department provided the Student Senate on current and upcoming plans for College of San Mateo and the rest of the district.

In 2022, the Facilities Master Plan identified the following priorities: Building 9 (Library) and Building 8 (Gym) modernization/replacement; Building 7 (Facilities Maintenance Yard) modernization/replacement; space optimization for campus needs; campus wide projects such as accessibility, pedestrian pathways, landscaping, wayfinding, and signage; addition of an art gallery; and turf replacements. Since then additional priorities have been identified, including: Modernizing legacy buildings such as the Fine Arts Complex (Buildings 2, 3, and 4); addressing maintenance items (HVAC, lighting, signage, and the Planetarium dome); addressing additional infrastructure issues (adding additional chilling capacity, de-coupling domestic and fire water); and technology infrastructure upgrades.

The college and the district are working to identify possible funding sources to address these needs.

FUNDING FOR DE-STRESS AND DISCUSS WITH DEMS

CSM Democrats requested funding for a de-stress and discussion tabling event.

Motion to allocate \$2,000 from the Club Assistance/ICC account (5031) to support the CSM Democrats Club's tabling event by Senator Zacarias; seconded by Senator Cheng. The motion was carried with all members present voting in favor.
