- I. **The meeting was called to order at 2:16 p.m.**
- II. **Roll Call**

 - a. c. Advisor

- i. **Aaron Schaefer, Student Life and Leadership Manager,** welcomed everyone back and expressed his hope that everyone is doing good in school. He stated that CSM has been running several programs to help high school students transit into community colleges and also the importance of keeping our students getting involved in their first year since we lose the majority of our students at this time. He also stated that there will be CSM Preview Days on Tuesday, Feb. 9th and Wednesday, Feb 10th regarding to the First Year Success Program with around 200 high school students from Hillsdale, Half Moon Bay, and Carlmont. Students will be having tours though out campus and panel presentations with current students. He asked people to sign up and volunteer as ambassadors for this tour from 9:30am to 11:30am on those two days. He also reminded the senators who has signed up for the Reboot Week of not being late. He stated that he will be out on Thursday and Friday this week.

Current Status In Inactive Files

Description

Foster youth, former foster youth, continue to receive priority registration until January 1 2020. Priority registration is also extended to homeless and formerly homeless youth.
A position is established in the Financial Aid department of the institution that informs students of the institution about financial aid and other assistance for foster and homeless youth.
Homeless and foster youth are placed in the scope of the Student Aid Commission program, which includes provisions for addressing student's needs.
Homeless youth will be made eligible for a fee waiver of the \$46 per unit fee if they meet other requirements also.

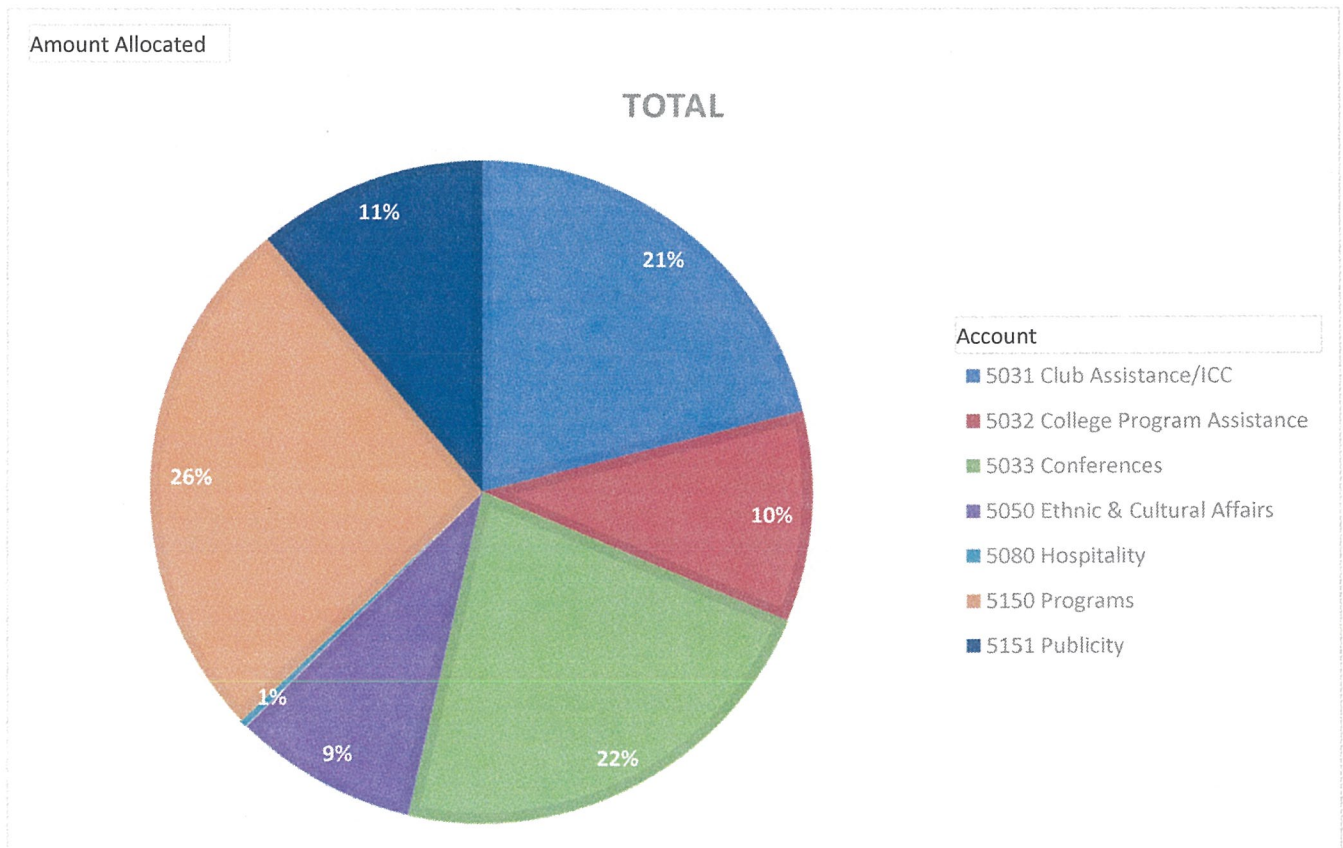

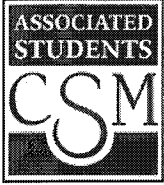
