### **REPORTS**

Secretary Chavez reminded the Senate that the District Student Council Mixer would take place on Friday, March 22<sup>nd</sup>, from 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. in the Center for Student Life. Mr. Chavez told members that, beginning with registration for the Summer 2019 term, students would be expected to pay for their classes one week after enrolling.

Student Life and Leadership Assistant Hamadeh elaborated on Mr. Chavez's last point, indicating that, the District had made the decision to eliminate a due date for payments without any student consultation or advertisement. This change, however, would not apply to students enrolled in a payment plan, international students, veterans, or those with third party payers. Mr. Hamadeh recommended working through Student Trustee Topete Eng Goon to communicate with District and find out why there had been no student input in such a drastic decision. Advisor Hamadeh also told the Senate that registration dates for the Summer and Fall terms would now be separated, with registration for Summer beginning in May, and registration for Fall in June.

#### DEBRIEF OF ASCSM EVENTS

Programming Board Co-Chairs Nava and Perrilliat thanked the Senate for helping out with the St. Patrick's Day Event which took place earlier that day; they stated that there had been an impressive turnout of students and volunteers.

### FUNDING FOR OPEN MIC NIGHT — CREATIVE WRITING CLUB

Senator Graciarena, President of the Creative Writing Club, presented the club's proposal for an Open Mic Night which will take place on Thursday, March 28<sup>th</sup>, from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m in Building 10, Bayview Dining Room. This is an opportunity for students to share their creative pieces, including poems and academic prose, with the campus community. Funding was requested for refreshments and facilities.

Motion to approve \$1,030.00 from the 5031 Club Assistance/ICC Account to fund Creative Writing Club's Open Mic Night by Senator Perrilliat; seconded by Senator Illini. By a vote of 9 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining, the motion carried.

### FUNDING FOR DISPOSABLE GLOVES — MEDICAL SCHOLARS CLUB

The CSM Medical Scholars Club requested funding for the purchase of nitrile exam gloves that will be used for experiments involving cadavers. This supply of gloves will give more students the opportunity to participate in the club's activities. The Medical Scholars Club hopes that more high school students will be able to partake in experiments, as well.

Motion to approve \$450.00 from the 5031 Club Assistance/ICC Account to fund Medical Scholars Club's purchase of disposable gloves by Senator Ryng; seconded by Senator Nava. By a vote of 9 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining, the motion carried.

### FUNDING FOR ART DE-STRESS WORKSHOP — EOPS CLUB

EOPS Club will be holding an art de-stress workshop for the campus community on Thursday, March 27<sup>th</sup>. This workshop will give students a creative outlet for stress. The EOPS program has already purchased most of the art supplies; the club will cover the purchase of the remaining supplies and the cost of a workshop facilitator.

Motion to approve \$575.00 from the 5031 Club Assistance/ICC Account to fund EOPS Club's art de-stress workshop by Senator Nava; seconded by Senator Ryng. By a vote of 9 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining, the motion carried.

### FUNDING FOR WORLD WATER DAY EVENT

On behalf of Senator Taylor, Secretary Chavez presented the Cultural Awareness Board's funding proposal for March 21<sup>st</sup>'s World Water Day Event, which will take place in Building 10, Bayview Dining Room, from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. This event will help educate the campus on water conservation and job opportunities within the field of sustainability. Funding would cover the purchase of supplies and catering for the event.

Motion to approve \$1,000.00 from the 5050 Ethnic & Cultural Affairs Account to fund the World Water Day Event by Senator Graciarena; seconded by Senator Langi. By a vote of 9 in favor, 0 opposed, and 0 abstaining, the motion carried.

The Western Psychological Association (WPA) was founded in 1921 to stimulate the exchange of scientific and professional ideas among students, professors, and practitioners of psychology. WPA Presidents and members have included the top psychologists in the world including Albert Bandura, Gordon Bower, Christina Maslach, Philip Zimbardo, Stanley Sue, and Elizabeth Loftus. Many of these presenters will hold a conversation hour with students immediately after the presentation. There will also be special programs for students sponsored by Psi Chi, the International Honor Society in Psychology and workshops on topics in statistics and research methods. We are looking forward to an exciting convention program that will be a valuable learning experience for students.




