Chair, Teresa Morris called the meeting to order at 2:17 p.m. There are changes in the agenda and the revised agenda is posted in Chat. The TEAM 111 family was added to the consent agenda. The committee had approved other basketball courses at the 11/12/2020 meeting. Lale Yurtseven had a general question about training that will need further discussion as we have other standardization questions. We will not be approving minutes from past meetings this afternoon. We will review and approve the minutes at the December meeting.

Courses listed on the substantive agenda have been reviewed for listed changes. Kamran will be added as co-author for Melissa Green's course proposals. Melissa was not able to complete the 5-hour training

proposals. Melissa was not able to complete the 5-hour training during the summer and is retiring at the end of the fall semester. We need to have an author or co-author who has completed QOTL or similar training recently.

Mounjed Moussalem is in the process of completing the QOTL training and cannot be a course author until after completion. He has some courses that need to be reviewed by the committee. Courses that already have DE supplements and are up for two or six year reviews should be submitted by the December meeting to be effective for next fall. The Chair reminded everyone that we follow a four-week cycle for submission and approval of courses.

Lale informed the group that she didn't attend the recent QOTL training and does not plan to attend such training as she is exempted. Does this mean that she cannot write courses or DE supplements? She has been teaching online for a long time. She helped some faculty write their DE supplements. Lee explained that Lale has a waiver and she can put this information in when she completes new DE supplements. We just cannot have language like "No training" in the section on faculty author training. We are documenting who has training and when the training was done. For Melissa's CIS courses, we will take out the "No training" language and replace it with "Collaborated with faculty member who completed QOTL training."

		Students have stuck with their routines and this has shortened the
		time for what they're actually doing in the field. Doug Williams

added that the Covid restrictions have opened their eyes to what is possible, and they will continue to pursue doing some things online post-Covid.

theory class, Doug explained that equipment helps students understand, e.g., the break of a certain pitch. If the students have a ball at home, they can feel the ball and the teacher can rotate the ball on the screen. This expedites the learning process. The Chair reminded the group that we approved the volleyball courses last week. In the past, we might have wondered about players having sports equipment at home, but it does make sense that students enrolled in TEAM and VARS courses would have equipment like balls and bats at home.

ENGR 240 Engineering Dynamics (3) – *approved with discipline assignment: Engineering*. Motion by Martin Bednarek, seconded by Ron Andrade, all members voting "Aye."

> (New DE supplement; changes in SLOs, assignments, and texts) This course is being reactivated to help students transfer in light of Guided Pathways. Jose Gutierrez noted that typically, students are not able to complete 2-year programs in this time frame. ENGR 240 can be taken in the third year when students' loads tend to be lighter. It is a major course but will not be required for the degree. This course will only be offered in the spring. There is a prerequisite that is offered in fall. Additional dedicated lab space will not be required.

Marsha Ramezane, Articulation Officer, will resubmit the course for articulation. Articulation is lost when a course is banked. ENGR 240 is not a GE course and is not governed by timelines; it can be submitted for articulation at any time, although action on the submission can take weeks, months, or a year.

V. Open Agenda

- Discussion on CSU GE Area F: Ethnic Studies
- Consideration for Local GE: Ethnic Studies

The CSUs have created a new GE Area: F for Ethnic Studies. We don't follow the CSUs' GE pattern but this will have an impact on our curriculum discussions. Malathi Iyengar, Ethnic Studies faculty, presented slides on the origin and definition of the term Ethnic Studies, including the fact that CSM students had been involved in the 1968 student strikes that led to the creation of Ethnic Studies. The term "Third World Liberation" had also been used for this movement. Some of the information is on the department's website. The Chair sent a link in Chat that contains the CSU definition that we can use as a framework for approving courses for Area F, based on SLOs. The deadline for submitting to CSUs is in February. The Ethnic Studies department will need to review our ETHN courses and other CSM courses that could have the Ethnic Studies GE. Do we want a separate GE area for Ethnic Studies at CSM? This is an exciting development and we will continue discussions in this area. Martin Bednarek pointed out that while CSUs added an Area F, if they are not expanding units, this takes away 3 units from Social Studies. Should we also add this as a local requirement?

The Chair replied that there is a district-wide conversation on this and interested parties are encouraged to participate in the discussions.
