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## **SUBSTANTIVE AGENDA**

*Courses listed on the substantive agenda have been reviewed for listed changes. - **New Course(s)**

DGME	176	UX Research Methods (3.0) – <b>approved with changes to description.</b> Discipline assignment: Multimedia or Graphic Arts. Motion by Lale, seconded by Beth LaRochelle, all members voting “Aye.”
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(New DE Supplement)

This course and other DGME courses discussed in this meeting will be part of a User Interface/User Experience Certificate that will be brought to Committee after these courses are approved. A big part of UX is research, and this course will give students industry skills in basic research methods. The Committee discussed with faculty Diana Bennett about the type of language used for the catalog description, since the Curriculum Handbook states that we do not use marketing language. Since Diana worked with Cañada faculty to create identical courses, the catalog description will now be the same one as Cañada's:

This course teaches the basics of user experience research methodology, planning, and execution with industry-standard tools, including docs, spreadsheets, study administering and data gathering software, prototypes, and presentation slides. Practical application of skills learned to inform product development and UX design are also covered.

- DGME 177 UX Data Visualization (3.0) – **approved with changes to description and title.**  
*Discipline assignment: Multimedia or Graphic Arts. Motion by Beth, seconded by Tamara Perkins, all members voting "Aye."*  
(New DE Supplement)

Same discussion related to the course description, so it will now be updated to match Cañada's:

This course provides an introduction as well as hands-on experience in data visualization for user experience (UX). It introduces students to the theory and design principles for creating meaningful displays of quantitative and qualitative data to facilitate decision-making and design modifications or choices.

Business/Technology Division representatives brought up possible similarities between BUS. 109 and CIS Python Data Visualization courses. After comparing descriptions, the Business one is related to business visualization for increasing clarity, CIS Python involves coding, and Digital Media focuses on making thing look and feel pretty. Suggestion to add "Design" to this course title to differentiate the different Data Visualization courses offered at CSM, so course title will now be "UX Data Visualization Design."

- DGME 178 Content Strategy & UX Writing (3.0) - **approved with changes to description.**  
*Discipline assignment: Multimedia or Graphic Arts. Motion by Beth, seconded by Lale, all members voting "Aye."*  
(New DE Supplement)

Same discussion related to the course description, so it will now be updated to match Cañada's:

This course teaches the basics of information architecture, writing for user interfaces, and content management using industry-standard tools such as docs, spreadsheets, design software, and presentation slides. Practical application of skills learned to develop content for user interfaces are also covered.

EMC. 425 CPR: Health Care Provider (0.5) – **approved**. *Discipline assignment: Emergency Medical Technologies. Motion by Lale, seconded by Kristi Ridgway, all members voting “Aye.”*  
Christy Baird explained how a number of students on campus benefit from CSM having a CPR class – EMT, Fire Academy, Dental, and Nursing. Currently, students have to enroll in private courses to get certified or travel to Skyline to take a class there. This will be CPR for Health Care Providers approved by the American Heart Association, and resources for this course will be shared between the District and the department. There was discussion on distance education for this course, and Christy said that they are making efforts to keep classes in-person, as students in these fields need to acclimate to touching people, and this is also required by licensing. The course prefix is EMC. to align with other campus.

- **Course Modification(s)**

ART 351 Beginning Black and White Photography (3.0) – **approved with the removal of “other” from representative texts**. *Motion by Dave Laderman, seconded by Kristi, all members voting “Aye.”*  
(DE update; 6-year update; change in hours, recommended prep, SLOs, objectives, and texts)  
Discussion and agreement to remove “other” from representative texts. The change in hours is reflected in the reduction of lab hours, and this is happening with all the other courses in the series. The recommended prep course was removed because that course is banked.

FIRE 721 Fire Academy Preparation (2.0) – **approved**. *Motion by Beth, seconded by Chris Smith, all members voting “Aye.”*  
(2-year update; changes in recommended prep and instruction)

- **New Program(s)**

- University Transfer Option A: California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) – Certificate of Achievement (34 units) – **approved with typo fix**. *Motion by Leo Cruz, seconded by Lale, all members voting “Aye.”*  
Marsha Ramezane explained that the Certificate of Achievement for students completing the IGETC Transfer pattern will be removed Fall 2025, so this new certificate is for Cal-GETC and replaces the old GE pattern certificate. A typo was noted and will be changed.

- **Program Modification(s)**

- Political Science – Associate in Arts Degree for Transfer (changes in requirements, units, general education and elective courses verbiage) – **approved with total units fix**. *Motion by Judith, seconded by Leo, all members voting “Aye.”*  
There was a technical issue in Curricunet that added up the units incorrectly. The total units should be listed as 18-19 units, and Deb Laulusa will fix that on the backend.
