## **OPEN AGENDA**

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- **Residency Requirement for Certificates Discussion**

During the last District Curriculum Committee meeting, Skyline and Cañada stated that they are moving towards changing their Certificate residency requirement to align with the AA Degree residency requirement. The current AA/AS degree requirements were approved 2 years ago by the Curriculum Committees, and they are interested in using the same language for the Certificate language.

Discussions among the Committee about the differences in certificate offerings between the three colleges and that within these offerings, the individual courses are not aligned across the District (e.g. DGME, COSM, CIS, and BUS.). A question was brought up about why this was proposed. Jeremy said that it is to align with the AA degrees, and this allows students to take classes all over the District, so it's most likely aimed at expanding access for students. Leo, a CSM Counselor, said that most students look at their audit, and he hasn't yet encountered an issue or request to cross-certificate.

Continued discussion on the merits of having a home campus, and it was pointed out that certain programs like Promise, International, and EOPS require a majority of their courses have to be taken at their home campus. Consensus from the members that they need more clarification behind the issue of certificates and what the full implications are. Question brought up: are we gatekeeping students not allowing this vs. our obligation to serve our students best, and how do we do that best?

Another question was raised wondering if this is already in the policy, and we just weren't aware of it, and if it's already done, then this discussion is a compliance matter rather than an approval matter. Jeremy pulled up Board Policy 6.26 (Transfer of Credit and Graduation and/or Certificate Program Requirements for Students Who Transfer among the District's Colleges), but that did not clarify the matter. Jeremy will bring this question up to the DPGC for clarification and also further discuss this proposed change with the District Curriculum Committee, and we will revisit this in the near future. When asked, Acting Vice President of Instruction, Danni Redding Lapuz, stated that the VPIs from the three Colleges have not discussed this matter.

- **Information Competency Discussion**

Jeremy stated that part of the local degree revisions to align with Title 5 updates took out English and Math competencies, which is why we removed the English competency requirement and have a new area for Math. So this leaves the matter of the Information Competency area, and CSM Librarian, Lia Thomas, shared with the Committee the status on Information Competency at CSM and across the District.

Lia told the Committee that the District Librarians have been meeting together and looking at this matter as a group since the end of last year. Skyline and CSM currently have an Info Comp requirement, and Cañada has never had it. Info Comp can be fulfilled in different ways: ENGL 100, 105 and LIBR 100 and a handful of other listed courses. The 6 Info Comp SLOS have to be a part of any course designated for Info Comp placement. These 6 SLOs have been around since 2010.

In working with the other District Librarians, Lia said that Cañada would like to have this requirement because it is something that they all think is very important, especially in the shadow of the recent elections. Skyline has met with their Curriculum Committee and District CTL, and their Librarian, Pia, has asked their Curriculum Committee if the Librarians could take a year to examine how Info Comp is being implemented, all the different ways they want major revisions to the GE Handbook language, the way that Info Comp is being met, and even the difference between "competency" and "graduation requirement."



Currently, students are not required to take a course; they can take a tutorial at Skyline or an exam, but the exam has not been offered since pandemic. The Librarians want to explore the different ways that students can fulfill this competency at other colleges. In the early 2000s, the ASCCC recommended that all community colleges have this competency. 100 colleges did it, but not everyone. Lia talked about perhaps moving to remove the competency, and maybe change it to a graduation requirement tied to core courses as it is an important skill for students to have today. And we want to make sure that we're fulfilling our end of the bargain and getting students to information literacy and competency.

Lia requested the same request Pia made to her Committee, that we revisit this next Fall. Everything remains the same as it is now with the completion of the courses or students can take the tutorial at Skyline. Let the Librarians do the deep dive and bring something back to the Committee, perhaps changing the name from "Competency" to "Literacy" or "Requirement." Give the librarians a year to come up with some potential solutions keep Info Comp, as we are all in agreement that Information Competency should be part of the curriculum. This is not holding students back from graduating, since it's part of the courses they are taking.

Committee members discussed how they strongly support including Info Comp, and some faculty gave examples of their students not having these competency skills, not knowing how to use academic databases, and not knowing how to cite sources. Lia explained that initially, Info Comp was only fulfilled by students taking a one-unit LIBR 100 course, but most students chose to take that in their last semester, so maybe it's requiring them to take it in their first year. There is a draft ILO in our local CTL to maybe genuinely embed Info Comp in courses. Lia has noticed that most of the courses currently listed as fulfilling Info Comp have removed all of the 6 Info Comp SLOs in their course outlines, but they are still listed as courses fulfilling the requirement. If there was a legitimate embeddedness of these Info Comp SLOs or specifically addressing information literacy that was in all of the classes from our ILO, that would be fantastic and would hopefully, solve a lot of issues.

Lia is requesting the next year to reexamine these courses and SLOs that we have existing in the Handbook because it is ridiculous to ask a course to add 6 SLOs, have them add it, and then nothing's being measured. There was supposed to be a measurement tool provided, but that didn't happen. She stated that what they propose needs to be a meaningful and sustainable program, including practical considerations like workload and personnel. Some ideas from other colleges: interdisciplinary approach, embedded librarians, and pairing LIBR 100 as a corequisite course to a required course like ENGL 100.

Jeremy thanked Lia for the update, and the Committee looks forward to revisiting this again next Fall.

**Meeting adjourned at 3:40 p.m.**
