TEAM 192 Men's Basketball Theory: Defense (1.5-3.0) – *approved. Discipline Assignment:*

Kinesiology or Coaching. Motion by Marsha, seconded by Chris, all members

voting "Aye."

Confirmation that this course is designated to be repeatable. The given discipline assignment of Kinesiology or Coaching is not consistent with other TEAM courses, so Teresa recommends the Department meets to discuss the other courses and whether or not to add Coaching to the discipline assignment.

Discussion of whether or not prerequisites should be included in higher courses when there is a family of courses. Teresa looked at lots of courses with families, and typically, CSM does not have prerequisites in courses within families. Badminton at Cañada has .1 as a prerequisite for their .2 course, but Skyline doesn't, so we are out of alignment either way. The families were created in 2013, and Teresa recommends to approve these courses, and also to go back and have a larger District conversation so that there's consistency moving forward and also see how prerequisites would affect enrollment. Discussion by members of whether families were created for repeatability or to show cumulation of skill. According to the repeatability guidelines, there are no clear rules about prerequisites. Mike Marcial said that he understood that the 1-4 was created to monitor repeatability, and supported however it
