<p>6.</p>	<p>Program Review/"The Great Read"</p> <p>Groups of 2-3 read 8-10 program reviews then wrote summaries about the program reviews. Another group from Academic Senate reviewed the summaries for trends and themes, especially related to campuswide priorities (Educational Master Plan, equity, distance education/modality). Summary of summaries recorded on Jamboards. Madeleine reviewed JamBoards and summarized around themes (<i>link to Jamboard Summary</i>). There were 6 categories/breakouts in two groups of three categories:</p> <p>Breakout One - Equity: Learning Communities always come up, but the majority of students are not in Learning Communities. Equity also means how supported are students (ex. Promise), how many touches for each student. Promise has dedicated Financial Aid staff, tutoring, retention specialists, etc. Not all Learning Communities are based upon ethnicity (Honors). Perhaps this could be based on Guided Pathways. What about ESL? Is equity the same as culturally relevant pedagogy? Faculty also need to know what we are asking of them when we talk about equity and what learning communities are for. How do we create measures/indicators for equity.</p> <p>Breakout Two - Challenges: Access to education in terms of enrollment and outreach, modalities of instruction and data. Student engagement, lack of engagement, relationship between lack of engagement and cheating. Enrollment is dropping. Access to support services is a factor. Confusion about matriculation, getting dropped for non-payment, especially for ESL. Outreach (Estela Garcia) does high school visits, as do Welcome Center staff (Priority Enrollment Program). 	<p>are not aware of it.</p> <p>Breakout Three - Best Practices: Zoom is really great for some things, including office hours, counseling appointments, etc. What aspects of what we do are better served by the virtual modality. Collaboration is a strength, especially those that enhance student participation and student's voice. ZTC and OER are important successes. Advisory committees for learning communities could be mirrored in other academic areas. Bringing alumni into classrooms helps encourage success and retention and can be expanded. Workshop option: how to bring alumni back to CSM.</p> <p>Agenda and Brown Act approved while there was still a quorum. Minutes will be approved in May</p> <p>Then Four - COVID: We lost a ton of students, esp marginalized students. The job market is better and that is our competitor. COVID magnified issues we already had.</p> <p>Five - Institutional Needs: Need for more data, how to understand and use data. More staffing and personnel, especially in small programs. Resources, facilities, classroom equipment.</p> <p>Six - Good Ideas and Opportunities: With transition to virtual modalities, this opens up opportunities in academics and student services. Dual enrollment is also an opportunity. We cannot lose what we have learned about multimodal pedagogy - it isn't on campus or virtual, but both/and. The same methods and students aren't necessarily enough, there is no going back. We need to pay attention to what students need/demand in terms of flexibility.
