- Welcome & Updates (15 minutes)
- *Favorite holiday food and drink : Anniqua likes stuffing. Kelsey is not a big fan of Turkey, but she loves cranberries.  - Dean Update (Kristi)
 - *Need to submit re assignment forms in mid to end of February. Kristi and Allie will work with the team to quantify the schedules Fall 2020-Spring 2021.*
 - *What other involvement do we need? As a team, we need to dedicate time and people to the efforts. Do you need a retreat? Or a multi-hour meeting? Place holders on the schedule rather than wedging it in later. Allie will follow up on this and reaching out to us.*
 - Cluster Work group (Alex & Anniqua)
 - *IPC update: Clustering activity went really well. Showed recommendations from RP group. 30 minutes was enough time. Feedback included discussion points that have already been discussed. Allie shared the timeline to explain how the clusters would crafted. Conversations about how they would enroll. IPC is aware of the process and is supportive. They understand the background knowledge.*
 - *A batch of Meta-majors of colleges were presented and they were asked to respond to them. What they like and what they do not like. Then provided clusters that the RP group provided. Each cluster was printed in a package to*

respond to what works, what does not, and what names to consider. Some completed the activity, but others discussed the information. Allie will provide the feedback they provided. Allie is looking for an on-line platform to collect the information. We will use those items.

- *Skyline, Canada, and CSM met to discuss the process and Skyline mentioned that we should use information that can be responded to and questions that students can respond to. Make the sorting process accessible for the students.*
- *Discussion about the sorting process. Maybe there is more overlap than is represented. For example STEM could be STEAM or BSTEAM. Could we re-think about what we have to connect the ideas in a different way to help students with exploration? Can we create an easier flow? ...RP group provided natural patterns that come of our group. We might consider comparing our divisions with what the RP group provides.*
