- Update from Counselor Sessions (10 mins)
 - o Friday sessions with 3 to 5 counselors each time. Highlights: How to insure equity represented in Academic and Career Communities and next steps from what we present there, Need to ensure stackable certificates and degrees that lead to transfer or career opportunities, Roll of Collaborative support teams and the role that counselors will play in those teams, Emphasis on Career (?), Bridging faculty and staff to assist students (?), Program mapper preview and make sure access to counselors to get students the support students need. - Deep Dive: Reviewing and Feedback on Academic & Career Communities (45 minutes)
 - o Safeguards against tracking: Do all areas includes stackable certificates and degrees?
 - How do we build something that doesn't further "pigeon-hole" marginalized students? Tracking meaning students have steered toward vocational rather than academic or a certain academic path vs another because of perceived ability to succeed. Have we been moving away from tracking by rules from AB-705?
 - Data & Support teams may just be the safeguards that we are looking for. This
 came out as we discussed the Applied Tech Academic and Career Community
 - Review of Applied Technology
 - Are any of the Academic & Career Communities limiting? Applied Technology is mostly certificates so is that too explicit in recommendations as to where it leads (support teams connections & what may help or hinder) should we combine Science and Applied Tech to mix degrees and certificates or mix some applied toward business management too. Perhaps a consideration of the support teams being shared between the 3 areas (sci, applied tech and bus management). Applied Tech does house degrees but they all have a ceiling as opposed to that transfer, so we must consider in the placement
 - Break-outs to discuss more. Share out from:
 - An architect major might not realize that there is a transfer option as this is currently configured
 - Can the title of the Applied Technology be a ceiling, but could it also be a realization that the attainment of one goal, leading to the bigger goal?
 - It would be nice to separate applied tech into other communities, but the drawback might be that the individual support might disappear.
 - We are all fine with leaving it as is right now, with strong support teams. We will look at this in the next year to see if we still feel it is the correct placement of those programs
